The endless chain plan has been started by the American Transvaal League, and sympathizers in Kalamazoo have received bundles of ten private post cards addressed to the President with instructions to sign and get their friends to sign and send to the President.

### WANT TO KEEP LOPIMER.

BOSTON, October 10.—More than \$20,000 has been subscribed since last Friday by rich and poor, learned and humble of every occupation, in Greater Boston, to the Tremont Temple fund of \$100,000, which a committee is trying to raise in the hope that Dr. George C. Lorimer will remain as pastor of the temple. The strength of this popular movement is beginning to be felt, and with the aid of the press the church hopes to accumulate the entire \$100,000 before next Sunday.

### THE ROYAL CYPHER.

OTTAWA, October 12.—The department of marine and fisheries has been advised through the colonial office that His Majesty has selected the royal and imperial cyphers which are to be used hereafter on government note paper buttons for military clothing or in any other respect in which the royal insignia is required. Hereafter the Tudor crown is to be substituted for any other crown that may be now in use in the design of the royal cypher.

### A CUP CHALLENGER.

SYDNEY, October 12.—You can state positively that a yacht will be built in Canada, either next year or the year following to compete for the America's cup. It will be built by parties interested in the Steel and Coal company Sydney. James Ross, Montreal, when asked about it to-night said that one must be built. Several thousand dollars will be subscribed toward building this yacht by the Cape Town Yacht club, who are largely the prime movers in the matter.
