Literature And Life By BOOKMAI

FIGURES We often say that figures do not lie, but that depends on the one who uses them, because they may be but the expression of the one who records them. The modern world thinks a great deal in terms of figures. They may tell, in a sense, whether a man is succeeding or failing in his business, and yet that is not always true, for if moral principle is violated in what we term success, then it is failure. In fact we are apt to make a sort of God of figures - we like big things, big business, big churches, big colleges and big cities. But we should not forget that the laws which govern thunder and the moving of the tides, look after the dew drop that falls from the flower in your garden. We need to think of what may possibly lie behind what we call little things. When Greece would turn back the pages of her glorious history, and point us to a situation that she is proud of, she would likely stop at Thermopylae. It was a small band of three hundred that stood there and told of times how brave men could die. There is a story in the Bible of three hundred men that still has lessons to teach. It is about a man called Gideon, who was one of the Judges of Israel in a very critical time. He was of humble extraction, but the material of which heroes are made was in him, and he was called to fight against the Midianites - for long a foe of his country. He got together an army of thirty-two thousand men. He was told that this was too large. Those of that number who were afraid of war were told to go home, and twenty-two thousand men were glad to get off. He was left with ten thousand, but again he was told that he still had too many. Then a peculiar and simple test was tried. They were taken to a brook and the manner of their drinking was noted. Those that got down on their knees and took a leisurely drink were put in a class by themselves. These numbered nine thousand and seven hundred. The three hundred who were left lapped as dogs, by dipping their hand and putting what they could carry to their mouths, then off to meet the enemy! In this case big numbers did not count. Once in Scotland a minister was very much discouraged because he had but one addition to his church in an entire year. "I have only a laddie to show for this year." But who was this boy? None other than Robert Moffatt who became a great missionary in Africa. Here again the Bible is our source of many illustrations, for Elijah illustrates the very thing. He was so discouraged that he threw himself down and asked for death to come. "I am alone" was his pathetic cry. He looked at figures but learned later that they did not tell everything. He found out that there were seven thousand loyal people in the country. Both history and legend have lent themselves to illustrate this also. In Great War I little Belgium stood up and said "We are not a road." Britain in 1940 did the same thing and under the leadership of Winston Churchill, who rallied the people of those little islands and astonished the world. Poets sing of the way "Horatius kept the bridge in the brave days of old." Figures do not tell everything. It is significant that small countries like Palestine and Greece have done wonders. And our own neat little province of P. E. I. has made its contribution to the political, financial and intellectual life of Canada, and many of her sons and daughters have carried her name far afield.
