IT PAYS to buy in this Province. FOR ENGLISH INVESTORS.—Mr. McCready has sent the following cablegram to Reuter's Press Agency London, which has a monopoly of the distribution of foreign and colonial news for all the British newspapers: "Dominion Agent, Charlottetown, reports on authority of Dominion Veterinary Inspector that mortality in silver foxes this season is lower than last year and no epidemic or serious sickness among foxes. The crop of pups is proportionately larger than last year. Capitalization is now five million pounds. Many English investors interested."

AMBULANCE OUT.—Wright's Ambulance was out yesterday conveying a student, Miss Hazel Callaghan of Notre Dame Academy to the Charlottetown Hospital.

LAI D UP.—The G. G. S. Earl Grey is now laid up at Charlottetown and is having her winter apparatus removed. She will remain here awaiting orders.

RUNAWAY HORSE.—Some excitement was caused yesterday evening when a horse belonging to Messrs. F. J. Holman & Co started to run from Huston St. by way of Prince to Mr. Holman's store and on the corner of Kent and St. George Sts. the wagon collided with a post; the two axles and wheels being broken and the vehicle altogether ladj smashed. The horse, however, was none the worse of the run.

MOTOR CARS INCREASING.—There are now something over thirty motor cars in the Island. At any rate, the number of licenses that have been issued for the running of these machines was thirty-two up to yesterday. Of these, six were taken out since the beginning of the present year; those to whom they were issued being Messrs. George L. Prowse, B. R. Holman, W. K. Rogers, R. H. Sterns and the Y.M.C.A. Automobile School (2). The probability is that this number will be considerably added to during the present summer. Indeed, another car arrived last night—a seven-seater Russell for Mr. E. H. Sterns. This is the second car, and of the same make that Mayor Sterns has got within the week.

CHAUFFEURS' LICENSES.—In accordance with the increase of motor cars in use in the province the number of driver or chauffeurs' licenses has also been growing since the opening of the present season. There are now twenty-two persons in the province who are qualified, in conformity with the provisions of the automobile regulations, to drive motor cars. Seven of these licenses were issued this year to the following persons: George A. Millar, Percy Jenkins, J. J. Davies, Jr., George McDougall, Ernest Rice, H. McAulay, and F. A. Mutch.
