THEOLOGY STUDENT TOOK HIS OWN LIFE AT MOUNT ALLISON

SACKVILLE, N. B., May 17—Allister Young, 20, son of Rev. George M. Young, D. D., United Church Pastor at Stellarton, N. S., and Mrs. Young, was found dead in his room in the Mount Allison University residence here, at 8:30 o'clock Saturday morning by Colin Matheson, a fellow student.

At the inquest held Saturday afternoon in the University residence, a verdict that "Young came to his death by his own hands by taking a poisonous drug while mentally deranged," was returned. G. T. Morton, coroner, of Middle Sackville, presided. H. M. Wood, M. L. A. of Sackville, was former of the jury.

While no motive for the deed was established, it is believed that mental strain and worry as to the outcome of the examinations were factors.

Evidence taken at the inquest disclosed that Young, who is a junior in the 'ogy, had been treated from time to time for mental ailments by Dr. C. L. Gass, of Sackville. Dr. Gass testified as to professional services. Dr. H. E. Bigelow, Dean of the University residence, who was summoned when the body was found, testified in this regard. Matheson told of finding the body.

The young man's parents were notified and his father came to Sackville immediately, returning in the afternoon by automobile. The body was taken to Stellarton in the evening by motor hearse.

As far as could be ascertained, the poison taken was cyanide, in capsule form. It is not known at what time he poison was swallowed.

Members of the coroner's jury were Mr. Wood, Stewart Fawcett, T. A. Siddall, Judson Rose, Joseph Dobson, D. M. Trueman and H. Stevens. Young's father is well known in several Maritime Province centres, having held pastorates in many of the larger centres before being stationed at Stellarton. He was pastor at Charlottetown, Halifax and Fredericton. He was also located for arduous time at St. John, Fairville, St. Stephen, Chatham, Hampton, Campbellton and elsewhere in the Maritimes.

The young man's death has cast deep gloom over the Mount Allison institutions, at which the annual program of closing exercises is now being held.

A small boy having been told in class to draw a picture illustrating a Bible story, drew a four-legged animal and colored it red, green and yellow.

On being asked by his teacher what story that was meant to represent the small boy answered brightly: "Why, that's Joseph's goat of many colors."
