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THE SAINT JOHN N.B., Aug. 23.—(CP)—Charles A. Alexander, Campbellton, was elected Grant Master of the Grand Lodge, Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick, during the annual convention in the Masonic Temple, St. John, late last night.

MOSCOW, Aug. 23.—(AP)—Izvestia, Russian government newspaper, hailed today as "a date of great historic importance" the first anniversary of the German-Russian non-aggression pact.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 23.—(AP)—President Roosevelt noted at his press conference today that the Board of War Relocation Authority, created about two months ago to coordinate the work of the various controllers who are charged with the Government with the mobilization of the individual industries.
