SEVENTY DEAD BY EXPLOSION

In Coal Mines at Pocahontas, West Virginia, Twenty-Nine Bodies Recovered—Fifteen More Killed By Mine Explosion at Blossburg—Rescue Parties at Work.

BLUEFIELD, W. Va., Oct. 6.—(Special)—In all 70 bodies have been recovered from the West Fork of Pocahontas Collieries Co. mine at Pocahontas Va, and a conservative estimate tonight placed the total dead at 70.

RUSSIAN SEIZE JAP POACHERS

VICTORIA, B. C., Oct. 14.—News was received today by the steamer Bellorophon, from the Orient, of the seizure of the Japanese sealing schooners Tai Fu Ku Maru and Daisan Taiwo Maru, owned by the same company as the Dai Ni Taiho Maru, which was raiding the St. Paul rookery, in Behring Sea, and had five of her crew killed and twelve captured.

It is not known just what portfolios will be left vacant by retirements and the shifting which it is understood the president has in mind, but it seems probable that Mr. Meyer will eventually become either attorney general or secretary of the treasury.
