## A TWENTIETH CENTURY CAMPAIGN.

The Dominion Alliance has formulated a scheme to secure one hundred thousand voters who will pledge themselves to give their votes for prohibition candidates at the next general election. The proposed pledge is as follows:—

"We the undersigned promise that at the next general election for the Dominion Parliament we will vote only for such candidates as will agree to do all in their power, if elected, to obtain the immediate enactment of such legislation as will secure the total prohibition of the liquor traffic, at least in these Provinces and territories that gave majorities for prohibition in the plebiscite. This pledge to be null and void unless 25,000 signatures to it are secured."

The Royal Commission and the Plebiscite have alike failed to secure for Canada the prohibitory law to which we are entitled, and which the temperance people of the Dominion ardently desire. We are compelled to believe that representative public men of both political parties are reluctant to legislate in accordance with advanced public sentiment in this matter. But no true temperance man will for a moment entertain the thought of abandoning the effort, now continued for nearly half a century, to secure prohibition. It has become clear that if we are to succeed we must secure the election of men pledged to prohibition and bring such pressure upon our representatives that they cannot possibly mistake or safely evade the people's will in this great matter. To this end the above pledge has been devised and an effort is now being made to secure as large a number of signatures as may be before the next election.

It is needless to say that the movement is purely and entirely non-political. The sole object is to bring to bear upon our public men the influence of the public sentiment in favor of prohibition. This influence will be brought to bear first upon the candidates of both parties by making them feel that they cannot obtain the votes of the men who have taken the above pledge unless they will promise to support prohibition in Parliament. Once elected the candidates pledged to prohibition will give us that measure.

It is to be noted that the Pledge does not bind any one to vote for the candidate of the political party to which he is, or may be opposed. Strong party men are naturally reluctant to vote against their political predilections, even with a great moral object in view. Such persons will be left free to simply withhold their votes, if the candidate of the party with which they are affiliated will not agree to support prohibition.

Nor does the pledge commit the party signing it to demand immediate prohibition for the entire Dominion. It takes account of the present backwardness of prohibition sentiment in the Province of Quebec, and only asks

for the entire suppression of the liquor traffic by law in those large divisions of the Dominion where the plebiscite has shown temperance sentiment to be largely predominant. In other words Prohibition by Provinces will be sought for as a preparatory step toward the ultimate and entire suppression of the traffic throughout the Dominion.

Within the next few months many GUARDIAN readers will be invited to sign the Alliance Pledge, and we trust that this Province, the Banner Province for temperance, will still retain its leading position by furnishing a larger list of signers in proportion to population than any other Province of Canada. One hundred thousand names in all are asked for. Our fair proportion of that number would be about 2,500. They will be readily obtained if the campaign meets with the success which we anticipate for it.

A recent trial given under naval supervision of the Holland submarine boat, has resulted in the recommendation by Captain Lowe that the United States order the construction of fifty of the Holland boats. The recommendation has been endorsed by Rear Admiral Rodgers. If all is true that is reported of the performances of the submarine boat a small fleet of that sort would be sufficient to sink the greatest navy afloat. But if one nation adopts these appliances for warfare under water other powers will doubtless do the same. It may be that the submarine war vessels will yet revolutionize marine warfare.
