CHANGES IN THE SOUDAN.

The Presbyterian Witness of Halifax recalls the generally forgotten fact that the Soudan was once a Christian country.

In 633 the Muslims invaded Dongola, but failed to wholly conquer the people. The Moslems were bought off with the promise of 400 slaves to be contributed yearly, 360 for the Kaliph and 40 for the governor of Egypt.
