BOUNTY ON SEALS.

HALIFAX, June 7.—Captain J. A. Farquhar, one of the best nautical authorities in Nova Scotia, writes advocating a bounty of \$2 to exterminate the seals on Sable Island and the coasts of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. This is a different species of seal from that in Newfoundland and the captain's contention is that the seal is a pest and is highly destructive of our best food fishes. He estimates that there are 30,000 seals on the sands of Sable Island and 12,000 along maritime province coasts. A bounty of \$2 would come to \$84,000, and he contends this amount would be well spent if the seals were destroyed.

A seal eats, he says, twenty pounds of fish daily, which amounts he figures to a value of \$6,132,000 annually. The seal itself has no commercial or food value.

MONTREAL, June 10.—Two boys were killed on the city streets last night, Moses Licker, aged ten, newsboy, being struck by an auto, on St. Catherine Street, after getting off a street car directly in its path, while Lucien Gauthier, five year old child while running across the same street to his father, was struck by a street car and crushed to death. Inquests will be held tomorrow.

CLAIMS THAT COLUMBUS WAS BORN IN SPAIN

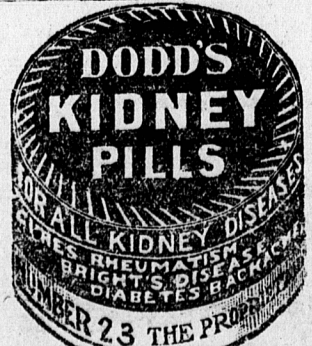
MADRID, June 7.—According to a provincial newspaper, "El Correo Gallego," which quotes the eminent Galician historian, Senor Garcia de la Riega, who has devoted many years of his life to studying the data relating to the birthplace of the discoverer of America, it now appears that Christopher Columbus certainly did not see the light in Genoa, as has always been affirmed. The senor says that he possesses a document proving that Columbus was born at Porto Sante, a small village near here. The historian is a person of authority, and was formerly in the late colonial office. In spite of his studies, however the documents he possesses, and his general authority, he will be severely criticized, and is sure to give rise to much discussion.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

A little soap, applied with the point of a led pencil, will remedy a squeaking edge. A clothespin will save time and the fingers if used to screw a small bolt into hard wood. Before cleaning a man's clothes with gasoline see that there are no matches in the pockets. All stains should be removed from clothing and household linen before putting in the wash. All linen articles, such as bed linen, table linen and towels, as well as linen worn on the body, should be boiled. If the bottom of a bureau be covered with a sheet of tin or zinc it will be protected from the intrusion of mice. Faded silk can be restored to its natural color by immersing it in soapuds to which a little pearl ash has been added. Always have a small opening in the centre of the pie crust on a fruit pie to allow the steam to escape while baking. Lamp chimneys can be quickly cleaned by holding for a minute in the steam from a boiling kettle and then wiped dry and polished. Butter will remove almost any kind of stain if rubbed well into it and then washed out immediately with hot water and pure soap. A tablespoonful of soda added to a quart of water and boiled in the coffee pot for an hour will thoroughly cleanse the pot. Rinse well. Don't save old trash, thinking that it may be used someday. The time and patience consumed in handling it can be compensated for by it. Marks made by scatching matches on the wall can be removed by rubbing lightly with a piece of cut lemon on then with a cloth dipped in whitening, and finally washing with warm water and soap. Stains which require hot water to take them out will come out much easier if hot milk is substituted. A woman who dresses exceedingly well says that it is a good plan to have two slips to one's embroidered lawn frocks, one in color and one in white. Turquoise and imitation rubies are used on dull button bands for the cuff, which is a fashion taken direct from harem beauties. Yellow aigrettes ornaments bands of black tulle or velvet ribbon; others in these black materials are clasped by buckles or clasps of rhinestones. Electric lights are to be installed in one of the oldest and most famous Hindu temples in India.
