AWFUL CASE OF CRUELTY TO CHILD

CORONER, May 15.—Harry Walden, of Gore's Landing, is accused of cruelty to a little girl, five years old, a daughter of Mrs. McWilliams, Peterboro, and a niece of Walden's wife. The charge was laid by Chief Ruse of Cobourg, acting for Barrister Goodwill, solicitor of the Children's Aid Society of Peterboro. Walden appeared before the Police Magistrate here in Cobourg. The child's body showed severe bruises, and it was alleged that Walden had kicked and struck her. His defense was that he struck at her with his snook, and that she was knocked against the table, bruising her head. Walden was committed for trial, bail being accepted.

Father Allan McDonald, Fort Augustus, has purchased from G. Arthur Esory one of the best horses seen on the streets for some time. It is understood that the price paid was a handsome one and it is pleasing to see that some Island people are determined not to let the best of the horses go away.

Joseph L. Gallant, of Abana's Village, left for home yesterday afternoon taking with him a beautiful young stallion, two years old, bred by Crown Ritchie, weighing nearly 1200 lbs. This animal was much admired by foremen when shown on the streets yesterday. It is said that Mr. Gallant paid in the vicinity of \$30 for the colt. The people of Abana's Village are to be congratulated on having such a horse in their midst.

Prince Edward Island has a better class of pure bred stallions than any place of its size in America. So says a distinguished horse breeder from Mass., "every grade of stallion being found there, from the Clydesdale to the thoroughbred; among the latter being included such a great horse as Woodburn, who was sired by the great King Alfonso, sire of Foxan the horse that created so much excitement in England and France some years ago, beating the world renowned thoroughbred at Newmarket and at Paris. Individually Woodburn is a great horse, as scores of American race courses can attest, being in his day one of the best race horses on the turf. In the St. Lawrence he has not been equalled as a prizewinner in his class by any horse exhibited to many times. He has won three special prizes for thoroughbred stallions in Canada and first prize at the Provincial Exhibition in Charlottetown 1902 and 1905. His colts are large handsome looking animals and just the kind of horses that buyers are anxious to purchase.
