After the President had expressed his opinion, which was strongly in favor of not selling the factory, and after a large number of shareholders offered to contribute towards paying off the small debt on the building, it was moved by Mr. J. C. Irving, and carried unanimously, that the final decision in the matter be left until the annual meeting of the Company in January next. In the meantime a canvass of the district is to be made, and the sentiment of every patron will be known at this annual meeting when 99 per cent. of the shareholders will probably vote against selling the factory—and may be it will be unanimous.—Q.
