—S. S. MORWENNA.— The S. S. Morwenna is due in Summerside at 6 o'clock this morning with a large freight.

—VESSEL WRECKED.— The Schooner Irene, with a cargo of lumber from Northern New Brunswick, bound for Sydney, struck on the shoals of Filtreo Point, about 10 o'clock Saturday morning and was driven by the heavy southwesterly gale high up on the shoals where she will likely be a total wreck. The Captain and crew of this men landed safely at Mont Carmel, The Irene was 64 tons and was built in 1879. She is owned by a company of which Capt. Moulton is manager. He was in charge when the vessel struck. The cargo belonged to Chappell Brothers of Sydney and was not insured. Captain Joseph Read, Summerside, received a wire Saturday evening from the owners of the cargo asking him to look after their interests. J.

REV. ELIAS SLACKFORD.—The death occurred yesterday morning, at the residence of Capt. J. S. Allas, Summerside, of Rev. Elias Slackford. He was 83 years of age and was a native of England, coming to Canada when a boy, with his parents. Over fifty years ago he entered the ministry of the Methodist Church and up to about ten years ago, when he was superannuated, had held several of the most important pastorates in the N. B. & P. E. I. and Nova Scotia Conferences. During the past year his health was not good and latterly his eyesight, which had been weakening for several years, failed completely. Two weeks ago he became seriously ill and gradually sank till the end came. He leaves to mourn three sons, John H. of Toronto, Edward, of Bingham, N. Y. and William H. Chief Clerk at Summerside in the Freight Dept. of the P. E. I. R. R. The funeral takes place at 8.30 this morning, the remains being conveyed by the eastern train to Sherwood Cemetery.

—ON THE WRONG HORSE.—Two Summerside young men, one an expert on motor-boats, the other on fire-arms and ammunition, wished to pay a visit to a village some fifteen miles distant. As the roads were not adapted for motor-boats and there being no shooting along the way they found it necessary to procure a horse for the occasion. A friend generously placed a horse at their disposal. The journey was safely accomplished, the night spent in the visited village, the return satisfactorily effected the next morning, and the horse put in its supposed owner's stable. The owner shortly afterwards went out to feed his horse and discovered that the horse was not his. Explanations were immediately demanded but none were forthcoming. The young men insisted upon it that they had brought the horse back and were as much surprised as the owner to find they were mistaken. The wires were kept hot for the next few hours and the discovery eventually made that the experts on motors and guns and things didn't know one horse from another and in their innocence had taken the wrong horse when leaving for home.
