SCHOONER WRECKED.—On Friday last the schooner Nellie M. Snow, while coming into Pownal Bay, from Pictou with a cargo of 98 tons of coal for Mr. Leonard Wood, was driven ashore and became a total wreck. She had on board her owner, Captain Charles Dunn, of Murray Harbour, and two men. All were saved. The vessel was about 60 tons, and was built quite a number of years ago. Neither vessel nor cargo was insured. 5147

AIDING RED CROSS WORK.—At the evening service in the Pro-Cathedral, Charlottetown, on Sunday, a collection was taken on behalf of the Prince Edward Island Women's Patriotic Association and Branch of the Canadian Red Cross Society. The amount realized was \$92.09, which has been handed over to the Treasurer of the Society, who gratefully acknowledges the receipt of the contribution. 5147

NEW Y. M. C. A. SECRETARY.—Mr. Harold C. Cross, the new Secretary of the Y. M. C. A., Charlottetown, arrived in the city from Montreal on Saturday night. The Montreal Star of the 28th says: "The departure of Harold C. Cross, ex-Boys' Work Secretary at the North Branch Y. M. C. A., was signaled last night by an ovation from more than two hundred members. Presentations of a kodak from the boys, and a remembrance from the managers, were made. Mr. Cross goes to Prince Edward Island, where he will have supervision of community work among the boys. He is succeeded here by A. L. Walsh. 5147

HOSPITAL SHIP FUND.—The contributions of the women of Prince Edward Island to the fund for the hospital ship which the women of Canada are presenting to the Imperial Government, have reached the handsome total of \$4,288. The subscription lists closed on Saturday, and from time to time already have appeared in these columns the names of subscribers and the amounts of their individual contribution. To that list has to be added the name of Miss J. McGregor, of French Fort, who subscribed \$2. The money was remitted to Toronto, the headquarters of the movement, in several instalments by Mrs. Rogers (Government House) who as one of the Vice-presidents of the Women's Hospital Ship Committee, had the conduct of the local campaign.
