LIVESTOCK

MONTREAL, Sept. 3-(CP)-There were 74 cattle, 50 sheep and lambs, 129 hogs, and 118 calves for sale on the two Montreal livestock markets today.

Prices on all classes of livestock were firm.

The cattle offered were mostly cows and bulls. Butcher cows were \$4.75 to \$7.25, tops \$7.50. Canners and cutters \$3.50 to \$4.50, common bulk \$4.50 to \$5.75.

Veal calves were \$9 to \$13. Good quality veals brought \$12 up. Drunkers \$7 to \$8.50 and grassers mostly \$5 to \$6.50.

Woods and wethers were \$11.50. Buck lambs and culled were cut \$2 per cwt. Sheep were \$3.50 to \$6.50.

The bulk of hogs were sold on a rail grade basis at \$14.75 for B-1 and \$11.25 to \$11.35 off trucks delivered live weight. Grade A drew \$1 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Premiums were \$9 to \$9 live weight.

Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, Sept. 5-(CP)-The quickened tempo and broader trading on the stock market which set in Tuesday were extended today. A number of issues made further headway through a sell-off towards the end of the session recorded some gains.

New highs were registered by Baturst "A", H-ward Smith, St. Lawrence Corporation, Foundation, United Steel and Wabasso.

Stronger issues among industrials were Hamilton Bridge, Cyprium, Dominion Tar, Dominion Bridge, Building Products, Desco "B", and Canada Car common, National Steel Car was softer and Car preferred lost a gain. C.P.R. was up and Canada Steamship preferred turned a loss into an advance.

Most utilities were out ahead, including Montreal Power, up a point, Shawinigan, Quebec Power, Southern Canada, Canada Northern, Power Corporation and Brazilian.

Total sales, 53,370 shares; Industrials 22,600; Mines, 30,900.

Toronto Exchange

TORONTO, Sept. 3-(CP)-Base metal stocks advanced again today on the Toronto exchange to a new high price level for the year. Posting an index gain of .73. The golds were up .45 while the industrials added .23 and the western oils lost .02. Volume was 357,000 shares.

Malarctic Gold Fields advanced 20 cents to a new high for the year at 2.01. Gains of 4 to 8 cents were showing finally for Annor, Beattie, Chesterville, Kerr-Addison, Mining Corporation, Sladen, Teck, Hughes, Tourn and Upper Canada and 10 to 15 cents for Pamour, Perron and Preston. McIntyre gained .14 and penny golds displaying definite strength included Macdon, Sturgeon River, Arntfield and Broulan.

Nickel and Hudson Bay added small fractions and Wabaco-Amulet gained 20 cents. Normaltel, Sherritt, Jack Waite and Denison Nickel were up narrowly at the close.

The list of active issues in the industrial section broadened and the gains widened to a point or more for Bell Telephone, Canadian Breweries pfd, Montreal Power, Canadian Bakers pfd and Consolidated Bakers.

The close was down slightly for Calgary and Edmonton and Davies Pete and slightly higher for Home Oil.

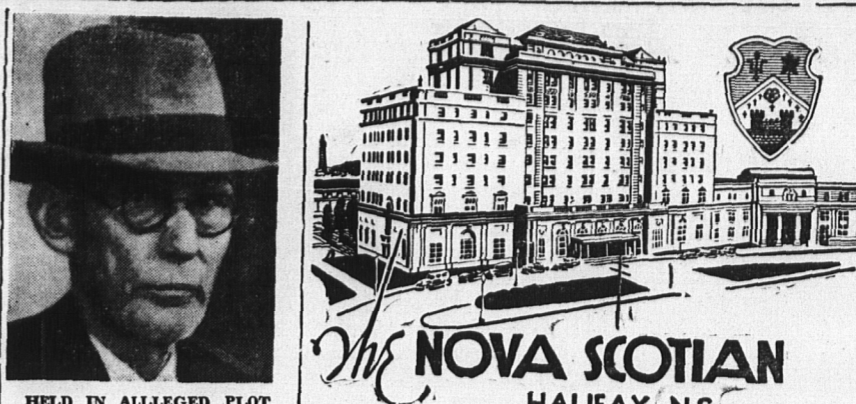

Town Of 1,800 Raises \$1,200 For Queen's Fund

Dime-a-week Club is operated in Melfort, Sask.

From dimes to dollars to hundreds of dollars is the record of the Dime-a-Week Club at Melfort, Sask., which has raised \$1,200 in four months for the Queen's Canadian Fund for Air Raid Victims. Melfort has a population of 1,800. Drawn together by a fellow feeling of the great need of the bomb-stricken people of Britain, twenty-four ladies of the town of Melfort met to discuss what they could do towards relieving some of the suffering of those who were being exposed to the German air attack.

Out of this meeting came the birth of the Melfort Branch of the Queen's Canadian Fund for Air Raid Victims, registered under the War Charities Act.

Plans were made for a Dime-a-Week Club, the town was laid out in sections and one member entrusted with the task of contacting every person in that particular section. Every house was visited and the plan explained. In practically every home a container for the dimes was left.

The first Wednesday morning of every month is collection day and the dimes roll in. Methods of checking and re-checking have been thoroughly worked out.

The formation of the Dime-a-Week Club has also made the whole town of Melfort conscious of the great need of others and from many different sources money is donated to this cause.

Other organizations in the surrounding district are beginning to affiliate with the Melfort Branch. Many of them have as their objective one hundred per cent membership in the club.

All members are agreed that they do not miss the dime a week fund that it is an ideal way to contribute to the parent fund.

The Melfort branch is pressing on for a vigorous winter campaign.
