Among the many contrived devices for teaching colts or horses to lead behind a rig, perhaps the simplest and one of the most effective is made by taking a long rope or heavy glow line, and extending it through the halter ring over the back, having a loop act as a crupper. The rope can be doubled and one knot made about the middle of the back, to form a crupper. By passing one end on each side of the neck through the halter ring, it will remain in place. When the colt pulls back, the rope (which should be tied to the axle or rear part of the wagon) tightens, and the rope device pulling under the tail brings him to his place. One or two pulls generally cures any tendency to rush back. The same treatment will cure a halter-puller in the stable.

There is not one horse in a hundred which will not eat too much if the food supplied is of good quality. Even when straw is being fed, it would be good practice to remove everything from the manger about three hours before each meal to give the stomach a chance to finish up one meal before it started to digest another. Many farmers feed too much to idle horses. Thus good food is wasted and worse than wasted, for it predisposes to attacks of indigestion.

The desirability of the dual-purpose function among the recognized best breeds gains increasing recognition. An American advocate of the Aberdeen-Angus urges Doodie breeders to develop the milking function in their cattle. In the coming rise in values and subdivision of farms he foresees the growth of a demand for a dual-purpose as contrasted with a special-purpose beef breed. There are already some good milkers among the Angus, and he thinks that by systematic effort on the part of its breeders the dual-purpose quality of the Black Polled cattle might in a few years be raised to a parity with that of the Red White and Roans. "Whenever this is accomplished," he says, "the demand for them will be increased a dozen fold."

There is danger in driving a horse on an over-loaded stomach. Consequently, the careful feeder never gives his horse a full feed of hay or meal at night when the stomach will have till morning to finish its work.

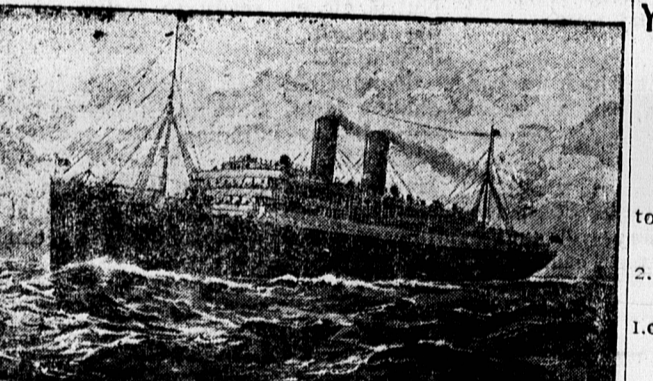
