—The latest news first of all.

—Artemas Lord, Charlottetown, was in Summerside yesterday.

—The Empress carried away from Summerside this week nearly thirty tons of smelts.

—A handsome silver grey fox arrived by the Empress last night and was forwarded by express to Alberton.

—John Fraser, East Street, Summerside, slaughtered a seven month's old hog a few days ago that weighed 284 lbs.

—LeBaron Thompson, T. P. A. for the Eastern Steamship Co., St. John, was in Summerside yesterday and went west.

—Mrs. John Davison and daughter returned to Summerside by the Empress last night from a three month's trip to the Canadian West.

—Capt. John L. Read, Summerside, left by the morning train yesterday for Charlottetown to take up the position of first officer of the new winter boat, Earl Grey.

—Mrs. Chas Dyer, Boston, was among the passengers leaving Summerside yesterday morning for her home, after spending three weeks with friends in Tryon and Summerside.

—The Provincial trustees of the Prince County Hospital, have received a donation of \$25 from F. W. Hyndman & Co., Charlottetown, in aid of the hospital fund.

—In Summerside yesterday dealers were paying 22 to 23 cents a doz for eggs; \$8.50 a ton for loose hay, \$4.50 for straw; 20 to 25 cents per lb. for butter; 20c a bus for potatoes; 40 to 41 cents per bus for oats and 8 to 9 cents per lb for pork.

—Mrs Amy Wright, Berkely, Calif., leaves on return to her home this morning after spending a month with friends at Victoria. She is accompanied by Mrs James Howatt, Victoria, who will spend the winter at California.

—Alberton dealers are paying 37 cents a bus for white oats and 38 cents for black; 21 cents a dozen for eggs, 20 cents a lb for butter; 19 cts a bus for potatoes; 10 cents a lb for hides; 8 to 8 1/2 cents a lb for pork; 10 cents per lb for geese; 13 cents a bus for turnips and \$8 a ton for loose hay.

—There passed away at Rose Valley, on Nov the fourth, at the advanced age of ninety years, Christy McLean, widow of the late Allan McLean, who predeceased her twenty eight years ago. The deceased was a member in full communion with the Presbyterian church in Strathalbane for over forty years, and retained the full use of all her faculties unimpaired till the end. During the last few years of her life, she on many occasions, expressed her desire to be absent from the body and to be present with the Lord. She was a woman who was highly esteemed in the community for her many Christian virtues and Godly life.


