HOW SOAP CLEANSSES

Anyone who has ever tried to wash without soap must have wondered by what magic a few slippery bubbles accomplish what rubbing and scrubbing in clear water fail to do.

Before delving into the scientific explanation, we must first understand the true meaning of dirt or soil. "Loose earth" may be your definition, but there are many other elements in the substance that darkens our skin and clothes and household goods. Soap, dry organic matter, oil and greasy food particles are also contained in what we loosely refer to as dirt.

Clear water will loosen and dissolve certain types of dirt from certain objects, but soapy water penetrates more deeply into any kind of surface. Aided by some mechanical action such as rubbing or gentle swishing, the soap solution detaches and breaks up particles of soil, then surrounds them with a film of soap which prevents them from reattaching themselves to the surface that is being washed. It also holds the particles suspended in the water until they are rinsed away.

Of course, soap without water is no better than water without soap. Together they make the perfect team for the achievement of good looks, comfortable living and sound health.

and flavor it with fruit juice? Have your food boiled or steamed; there are many ways of making it most appetizing. When summer greens are plentiful and cheap, what about some mixed salads? Most people get fat because they don't pay enough attention to the right proportions of their food. Here's a good typical day's diet: a boiled egg, one slice of toast and some fruit for breakfast; a meat dish with green vegetables and stewed fruit for the midday meal; and a light evening meal, fish or eggs and a salad. Now suppose you find yourself losing weight when you don't want to—slimming without meaning to. If you feel well you're probably losing weight from one of two causes: (a) perhaps you're working yourself too hard, (b) you're not eating sufficiently nourishing food. Of course, both causes may be contributing. Deal with (a) first. Take life more easily—if you can. (b) Adjust your diet. You may find you're not eating enough butter; that you're not drinking enough fluid. Or perhaps you eat your food too hurriedly and don't digest it. Try increasing the amount of fat and starch you eat—but means more butter, milk and cream; more bread, puddings and cereals. Cut down meat and fish to make room. After a month, weigh again and see if you're gone up a pound or two. And remember, other things equal, a healthy person's weight doesn't vary much. So, if the diet you're eating is keeping your weight steady, and you're in good health, I shouldn't play tricks with it if I were you.
