time to come. New machinery has been ordered which when installed will increase the output in both knitting and cloth departments. In the past the Hewson Mills made a great variety of cloth and knitted goods and it is now proposed to specialize on the best selling lines. It is anticipated that in 1912 Hewson Pure Wool Textiles, Ltd. will have sales amounting to \$600,000. Last year Stanfield had the largest season in the past ten years, the largest increase in business in any year being in 1911. The business in this province grows steadily and the goods are now firmly established here and a ready market.

Mr. Stanfield had a timely word of the election of the Matheson Administration. He said that in the past he thought P. E. I. Governments had neglected to properly encourage sheep raising. In the Truro Mills \$250,000 worth of wool was bought annually and \$150,000 worth in Amherst. He thought that this should all be produced in the Maritime Provinces. In stead of this only 50 per cent of Maritime wool is bought by the Truro Mills and but 25 per cent by Amherst Mills. He characterized the land here as the best in the world and regretted the fact that P. E. I. land wool was deteriorating in quality being coarser and poorer than for merly and does not reach the market in good shape. The result is that island wool is not as satisfactory as the mainland product. He saw no reason why the new Government could not take steps to work a much needed reform in this respect—encourage sheep raising as an additional asset and one of the resources of the province.

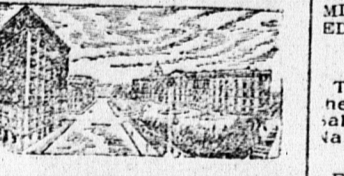

CONFESION SAVED TWO BRITISH SEAMEN FROM DEATH

WASHINGTON, Jan. 2—President Taft today commuted to expire to once the life sentences of Arthur Adams and Robert Sawyer, two negro British subjects, convicted at Wilmington, D. C., in 1906 of murder on the high seas. In a confession before his executive Henry Scott, another negro convicted of and hanged for the same crime completely exonerated, Adams and Sawyer. The two men had been condemned to die, but President Roosevelt commuted their sentence, on application of the British Ambassador. The men came from West Indies.

The murders were committed on a American schooner, A. H. Berded, whose four white officers, master, engineer, mate and cook, and one negro seaman, were killed while the vessel was off the coast of North Carolina, Oct. 19, 1906. During the voyage a controversy arose between the master and the sailors over food and other matters. After the five men had been murdered, Adams and Sawyer succeeded in overpowering Scott. They signalled a passing vessel and all three were taken into custody at Southampton, N. C. During the trial at Wilmington, it is said, Scott was very bitter towards Adams and Sawyer and charged them with complicity in the crimes. Before his execution, however, he made two written confessions, which he confirmed in a statement on the gallows, July 6, 1906, assuming full responsibility for the murders.

The Supreme court of the United States gave the lower court opportunity to grant a new trial after the confessions. Because of lack of funds the prisoners were unable to avail themselves to this privilege.

WOMEN TAKE ART PRIZES

LONDON, Jan. 2.—At the recent gold medal night of the Royal Academy, the women students carried 12 prizes out of fourteen for paintings and drawings. It was only when the announcement of awards for sculpture and architecture was reached that the men asserted their lead, for these essentially masculine arts he lady students had no chance, all the gold medals and travelling stipends going to John Angel and Alan Blincoe respectively, and the remaining four prizes to members of the same sex.

But Sir Edward Poynter's trusts and sallies against the reprehensible tendencies in modern art which are a evidence at so many exhibitions, and his placid satisfaction with Roy Academy teaching as the only way of artistic salvation, wanted strong backing than the unrelieved majority of the present students' work. Apart from the sculpture, which is of quite unusual merit and unsurprising maturity, there was upon these walls no trace of genius and scarcely a hint of promising talent, according to a London critic. He says:

"If a gold medal had to be given or a historical painting, no one can find fault with the justice of the award, Miss Williams' picture 'The City of Refuge,' being immeasurably superior to the other six versions of the subject. It shows at least sound academic craftsmanship and serious endeavor, although the result is artistically utterly insignificant, dull and disagreeable in color, and of no decorative value whatever.

On the other hand, Mr. Angel's gold medal for a composition in sculpture, 'Rescued,' while lacking in power and passion, is of another massively blocked-out group by a less fortunate competitor, had a tenderness of feeling and delicacy in the rendering of forms that fully justify the award. Altogether the sculpture classes at the Royal Academy are far more successful in their teaching than the painting and drawing classes."

SITUATION IN CHINA

PEKIN, Jan. 4.—Conference continues to revive among the adherents of the Imperial Court. The Chinese nation is very easily encouraged or discouraged. Nowhere else in the world could 80,000 ounces of gold bars such as were delivered from the Imperial purse into the hands of Premier Yuan Shi Kai yesterday seriously affect a great empire at a critical moment. The belief is current that fighting will shortly be resumed. Premier Yuan has not received any reply from Wu Ling Fang at Shanghai, whom he informed that he would in future carry on negotiations by telegraph. The Imperial delegates have returned from Shanghai and state that a reign of terror prevails in that city. Nobody dares to venture an opinion in favor of constitutional Monarchy.

LORD MAYOR'S MEAGRE \$50,000.

LONDON, Jan. 2.—To be Lord Mayor of London and live on \$50,000 a year, the official allowance for maintaining the high dignity of that office, is a problem which most chief magistrates find beyond them.

It was with this financial puzzle inquiry into this financial puzzle that Mr. Carl Hentschel moved at the Court of Common Council meeting at the Guildhall that the General Purposes Committee should be instructed to consider and report "on the question of the expenses of the Mayoralty."

An idea of what it really costs to be Lord Mayor of London was given in an interview by Sir William Treloar, who held the office in 1906, "I have heard of a case," he said, "where a Lord Mayor spent \$150,000 more than his allowance, and of others where an additional \$100,000 was expended. I know myself perfectly well how easy it is to spend \$50,000 above the allowance. More than that I cannot say, except that I do not think it is possible for any Lord Mayor to keep to his official \$50,000.

A few of the chief items upon the expense side in the balance sheet of a Lord Mayor of London were supplied by an alderman who has passed the mayoral chair.

"Of course," said this ex-Lord Mayor, "there is really no limit to a Lord Mayor's expenditure. It depends entirely upon his own inclination." Some of the other expenses that a Lord Mayor has to meet are the salaries of secretaries, the wages of the Mansion House servants, numbering between forty and fifty, and the upkeep of horses and carriages, apart from the state coach. Many, too, are the demands of charities upon a Lord Mayor, and it is estimated that it is impossible for a Lord Mayor to keep his expenditures below \$65,000 or \$15,000 above the official salary.
