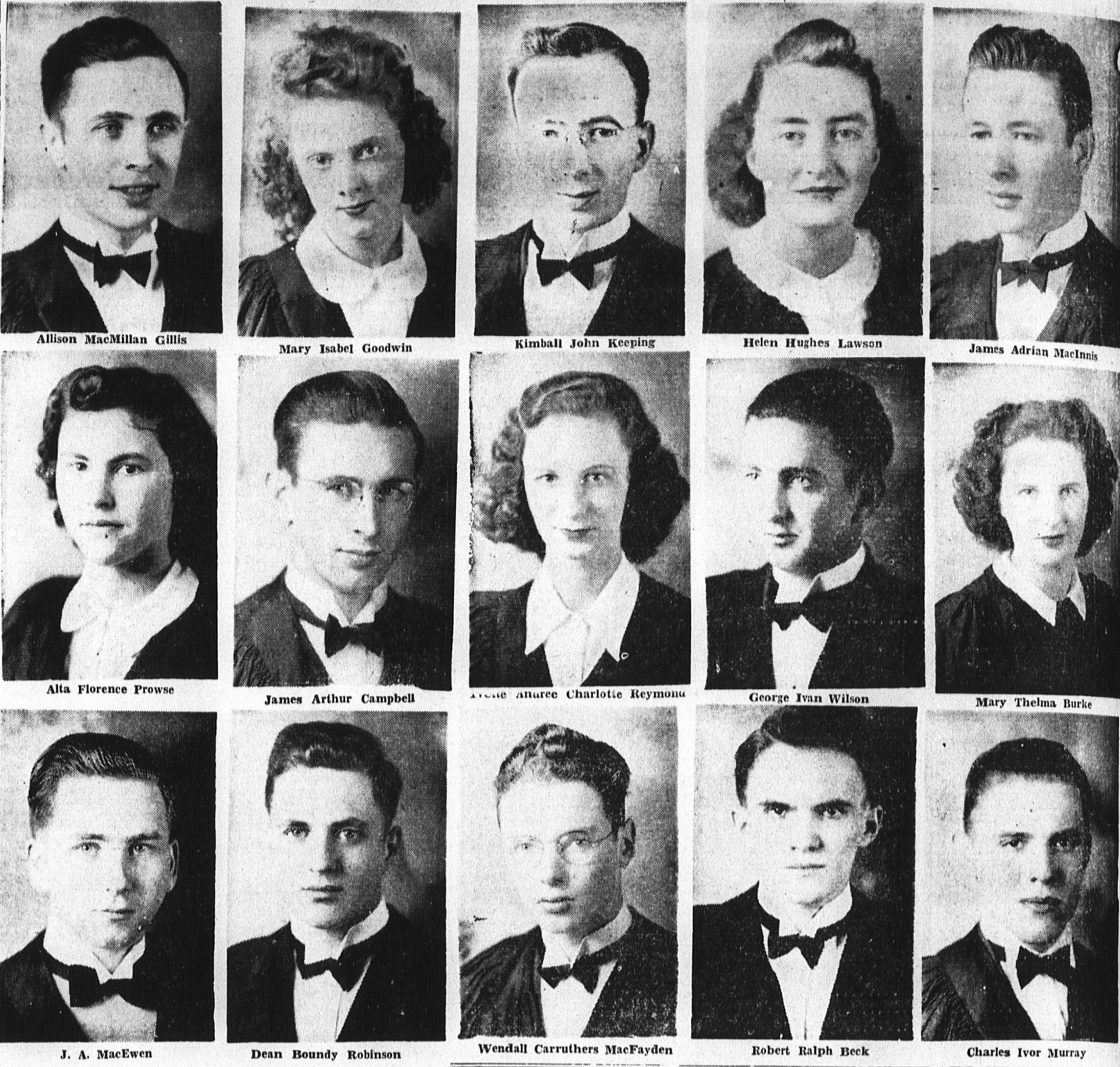

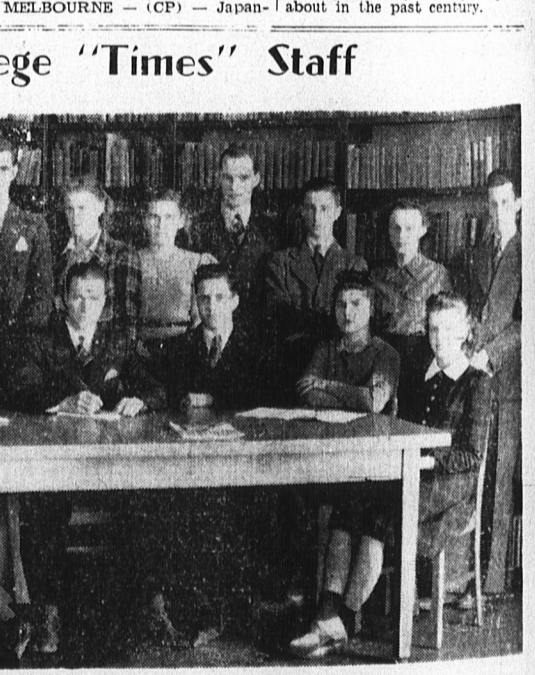
STRIPING OFFERS MANY NOVEL EFFECTS
Striping may be the answer to the housewife's plaint that a one-color interior wall paint job, when finished, looks "all right" but still seems to "lack something". Striping means running narrow bands of paint around the walls, a few inches from the parrel with the wood trim.

The width of the stripe, its color, and the distance from the wood trim will usually depend on the size of the room, on the amount of decoration required to offset the objectionable plainness, and also on the boldness or prominence of the door and window casings.
