

THE PRINCE ELECTION

The Opposition Candidate Elected.

BY A SMALL MAJORITY

An Unexpected Result—Conservative Gains in French-speaking Districts.

There was little general interest taken throughout the Province in the by-election held yesterday in the First district of Prince. In Charlottetown the active politicians of both parties were on the alert to hear the news, but until it came the opinion of the large majority was that Mr. Gallant would receive the majority of votes. The result proved otherwise and has excited some surprise.

Mr. Gallant had the advantage of some experience and the sympathy that usually comes to a candidate who having been once returned by a good majority is afterwards unseated by the courts. The changes appear to have been principally in the French-speaking sections of the District. Various reasons are assigned for these including the unpopularity of the lobster and oyster fishing regulations. And it is hinted that some electors, with a desire to influence a pending judicial appointment, may have voted for the Opposition candidate with a view to make the government reluctant to open another constituency at the present time.

A MONUMENT.

To the British Soldiers Who Fell at Bunker Hill to Be Erected.

The Victorian Club dined Thursday evening at Squantum and discussed the proposal to erect a monument to the memory of the British soldiers who fell at Bunker Hill. There were about forty members present, and the feeling was unanimous in favor of the plan. Messrs. B. B. Cusher, James H. Stark, Hugh Cairnes and others spoke. It was resolved to push the plan, and a definite practical movement will be begun in November. A plain obelisk is thought of as the best thing for the memorial, and the cost is figured at \$3000. The idea is to erect the monument in the cemetery on the common where the British heroes were buried. The shaft will make another link in the chain of Anglo-American unity.—The Anglo-American.

THE CABLE PROJECT

Sir Charles Commands the Government.

A RETURNING OFFICER

Flies to Escape Giving Evidence—Canada and Imperial Defence.

OTTAWA, July 25.—(Special)—Parliament this morning discussed the Pacific cable project, Sir Charles Tupper congratulating the Government for its efforts in inducing Great Britain to assist in the work.

Albert G. Bradler, who was sent to serve a subpoena on James Farr, returning officer for West Huron, submitted an affidavit that Farr had gone to the States to escape service.

There was no other important testimony.

A London despatch states that in the British House of Commons, Mr. Wyndham stated proposals had been submitted to the Dominion Government in the line of contributing to Imperial defence, the nature of which he could not indicate.

KRUGER RESIGNED

The Presidency But Resumed His Office.

THE PRESS CENSORSHIP

In Manila—New Commander for Paris—Villeneuve Under Arrest.

LONDON July 25.—(Special)—There is much difference of opinion regarding Kruger's resignation, but the belief is that he submitted it and was induced to withdraw it again on the Vickersad passing a vote of confidence in him. Manila advises say the end of the war not in sight. The press censorship is now even more rigorous than before.

PARIS July 25.—(Special)—General Dalstein has been appointed Military Commander of Paris.

Captain Villeneuve, who wrote sympathizing with the anti-Dreyfus movement, has been placed under sixty days rigorous arrest.

A trial summons will be issued to compel the attendance of Esterhazy at the Dreyfus court-martial and he will be given a safe conduct, to Rennes and return.
