The P. E. Island Presbytery was in session Tuesday morning and afternoon. In the morning Assembly reports were dealt with. Rev. Andrew Gray, of Murray Harbor was elected Moderator. Rev. W. H. Spencer convener of the Augmentation Committee submitted his report, which was adopted after a brief discussion. The resignation of Rev. W. A. Mason from Lots 14 and 16, was accepted, to take effect on the last of April. Rev. Robert Murray of O'Leary was appointed moderator interim. Rev. R. P. McKay D. D., of Toronto Secretary of the Foreign Mission Board was nominated as moderator of the General Assembly which meets in Ottawa next June. The following were appointed commissioners to the General Assembly. Revs. A. Craise, A. S. Stewart, W. H. Spencer, Robert Murray, and A. J. McNeill ministers, Lt. Governor Rogers, T. G. James, M. D. McLeod, D. K. Currie, and George E. McNutt. Several catechists were certified to the Home Mission Committee for work. Rev. R. G. Sinclair presented the Sunday School report, which was adopted. Provisional arrangements were made for the induction of Rev. H. J. Fraser of Loggieville, N. B., into the charge of the Sumneride congregation. Rev. R. G. Sinclair to preside and induct. Rev. R. G. Strathie to preach. Rev. Robert Murray to address the people, and Rev. E. J. Rattee to minister.
