SENATE REFORM.

Nothing of human device is perfect. The constitution of a state framed by wise men with the utmost deliberation must of necessity in after years be changed to meet the views and wishes of succeeding generations and the new wants and requirements of the time. The British constitution, unwritten as it is, has been the evolution of centuries. The constitution of the United States was framed by great and wise men, and much of their work stands approved to this day, but there have been many changes. The nineteenth century reviewed the work of the eighteenth, and one of the most important guarantees, that which pledges equal liberty to black and white, was added so late as 1870.

Canada has a written constitution, and it, too, was framed by great and wise men, but time has demonstrated the need of some changes. One of these is in regard to the Senate. The framers of the British North America Act modeled our Senate after the imperial House of Lords. They provided for life appointments by the Crown. Ninety years before the framers of the United States constitution had created a Senate chosen by the State Legislatures, one third of the number renewable every two years. It was also given some important powers as to the ratification of treaties and the confirmation of important appointments which the Canadian Senate does not possess. And in this body all states have an equal representation of two members each.

The result has been that of the two Houses of Congress the Senate is the more weighty and influential body. Its 90 members outweigh in the decision of great questions, and their speeches and deliberations are of more interest to the people than those of the 357 members of the House of Representatives. In Canada the reverse of this is true. Our Senate is as large a body numerically as the Senate at Washington, but of the sayings and doings in the Red Chamber at Ottawa the Canadian people take no account except on rare occasions. The newspapers do not find it worth while to mention the proceedings of the Senate except a very few times during the session. Its spacious galleries are unoccupied from day to day while those of the Commons are crowded.

Such are the bald facts. One of our two Houses of Parliament is in need of radical reform. It is not fulfilling the purpose for which it was created. It is a

disappointment to the Canadian people. Our Ottawa despatches of yesterday morning show that this is the conviction of the leaders of both parties—of Sir Wilfrid Laurier and Mr. Borden alike. A change must be made in the constitution of the Senate. It must be brought into touch with the people, infused with new life, and made the active, influential, useful legislative body that it was intended to be. This will take time. It will require careful deliberation. It will require the concurrence of both political parties, and of course, it will require imperial legislation. Not this year or next year may this be effected, but we may rest assured that some radical change in the constitution of the Senate is inevitable, and cannot be very long delayed.
