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Many Comment

On Progressive Summerside

Visitors to Summerside who come every year at this season for the fur trade are struck with the improvements that they find from year to year. New paved streets, new buildings, up-to-date stores and many other things that few small towns can boast of.

The fur trade has in some measure brought prosperity to Summerside and this season of the fur industry. Fur buyers occupy windows on the main street and brisk bargaining takes place between the fur rancher and buyer.

The fur houses are busy too handling furs for the fur auctions in the large cities of Canada, New York and London. Many thousands of dollars change hands during the fur season in Summerside.

The fishing industry also contributes its share to this season. Large quantities of smelts are shipped from Summerside to Boston and Montreal, providing a livelihood for many townsmen.

Another industry which has sprung up in Summerside of late years is the chicken factory of Mr. Hewitt. Mr. Hewitt finds it necessary to import chickens to keep his factory running. The factory is also a relatively new industry and gives employment to many young people.

The lumber firm of Mr. F. Schuman and Co. has just completed a new shed for storing their lumber, which is a fine addition to their establishment. The shed is on a concrete foundation and is 98 feet long and 57 feet wide.

This year was a busy one at the Marine Wharf, six steamers call here to take on full cargoes of potatoes and other produce, mostly for American markets. This activity was a great boom to the stevedores and not for some years have they had such work at this time of year.

Summerside is looking hopefully to the future, going forward always, with some new feature added year by year.

peated raids on French outposts between the Rhine and the Moselle Rivers. Larger bodies of troops were used than hitherto employed in the nightly patrolling operations carried on constantly by both sides.

Reports indicate the German raids accomplished little and their purpose is not clear.

In the air the British assumed the offensive in vigorous fashion with security patrols over German territory. German fighters on some occasions were seen in the North Sea. This may be an indication of the numerical superiority of the German air force.

The sea battle which sent the pocket battleship Graf Spee running for shelter in a neutral harbor at the very least demonstrates that the British are fully capable of dealing with the ships on which Germany placed most reliance.

Whether the appearance of a German naval squadron in the North Sea indicates a bolder attitude by the German Navy than hitherto remains to be seen.

It may be the Nazi naval command is convinced much of the British fleet is busy hunting raiders in the Atlantic and that a little manoeuvring in waters near home is now safe.

German's futile attempts to undermine Britain's mastery of the seas at least brought about a direct clash between warships of the two nations with the result that one of Germany's most powerful ships is probably out of action for the balance of the war.

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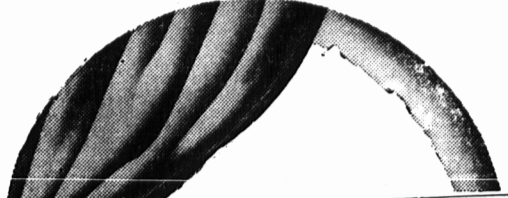

School children and teachers are busy making preparation for the Christmas Tree and Concert.

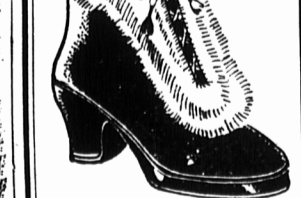
