OTTAWA, Aug. 22.—Canada continues to cut down her expenditures abroad, and according to the summary of Canadian trade for the month of July, 1922 at the same time is increasing her exports of domestic merchandise.

Exports of domestic merchandise during the month of July, 1922, were valued at \$69,737,019, a decrease of nearly two million dollars from the July 1921, total valuation of \$71,737,019.

Sixty years ago a "mystery ship" left the Mersey, the sailing of which ultimately cost Great Britain more than £8,250,000. This was the famous Alabama, known while she was on the stocks as "No. 290."

The Alabama was regarded by Yankee vessel owners and captains as the scourge of the seas. She practically destroyed the northern merchant marine and drove the Stars and Stripes from the ocean for a time.

Rapids, this man who rode "into the jaws of death" into the mouth of hell" recalls the charge. He saw Capt. Nolan, save young aid de camp of the British commander, Lord Raglan, dash up and hand Lord Lucan, Cavalry commander a note. Mr. Cutting, then a 17-year-old British trooper did not know what the note contained. History says it contained these terse orders: "Lord Raglan wishes the cavalry to advance rapidly to the front and try to prevent the enemy carrying away the guns—French cavalry is on your left."

Cutting saw his commander thrust that note into his glove before its bearer rode away. "Forward the Light Brigade!" The command rang. There was a flash of sabers. Down into the Cedravalley dashed the line of British

horsemen, to certain destruction. After the Crimean war, Mr. Cutting went to India with the British troops and served through out the Indian Mutiny. He marched from Delhi to Lucknow and participated in that famous siege. Later he served in Egypt and in 1857 in South Africa, receiving honorable discharge from the British Army in 1860. In 1871 he went to the United States and engaged in railroading until his retirement some years ago. He is still hale and hearty and will doubtless live for many years yet, and at his death should be remembered among a nation's great ones.
