## ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

**BAND at the rink Monday night.**

The rink will open Monday night the ice has done splendid through the thaw and now is in fine condition. Don't miss the opening night.

The Manchester Trader arrived at Georgetown Thursday afternoon and is being loaded with lighters, where the new lies outside Wickham's Light. The loading is consequently much slower than it would otherwise be.

The ferry boat was caught in the middle of the river yesterday from ten o'clock till four with a boat load of passengers. Hundreds were also delayed on the Southport side for the greater part of the day.

The Friday market in the City Bazaar was well attended, poultry and vegetables principally being offered for sale. In poultry, geese are ranging at 30 to 37, fowls 50c to 80c, ducks \$1 per pair, turkeys 10 to 11c per pound. Wholesale buyers are paying prices as follows: 8c per lb for geese, 11c for chickens, turkeys and 80c to \$1 a pair for ducks. There was very little staple produce, and the prices are unchanged from last market. Eggs are selling at 24 to 3c per pound and smelts at 12 cts. There was considerable pork in, selling from 7c to 7 1/2 cts.
