LICENSE FOR POOR PUSSY PROPOSED.

BOSTON, Mass., Feb. 9.—Mrs. William Minot of 142 Marlboro Street is the originator of a bill unique in the legislative annals of the Commonwealth. The official title of the measure is "A bill license cats," and it aims to put the cat on a level with the dog in this respect.

Mrs. Minot, when asked why she and so many others favored the passage of such a bill, replied: "First of all, for the cat's own sake. I feel sure that the owners of cats would place a higher value on them if they had to pay a license fee of \$1 for a female and \$2 for the male. Furthermore, fewer cats would be deserted, as so many are now.

"You know, as it is now, you can shoot a cat trespassing on your grounds, because that cat has no legal standing. Now, a dog is no property. We want to make the cat property too.

"Under this bill," continued Mrs. Minot, "all unlicensed cats would be painlessly killed. The president of the Animal Rescue League has to dispose of 30,000 cats annually, so you can see how many 'undesirable cats' there are."

BRIDGE WHIST GAMBLING.

ALBANY, Feb. 7.—Bridge whist and Wall Street speculation were denounced as glaring gambling sins of society by Bishop Williams, of the Episcopal diocese of Detroit, in a sermon here today.

"Is there a spectacle more degrading, more abject," said the bishop, "than a man with a will in him jangling breathlessly upon the throw of dice, the dealing of cards, the running of a horse, the whirling of a wheel, the sway of a game or the fluctuation of the stock market? The man that was meant to master fate has voluntarily surrendered to mere chance. There is nothing that so saps and destroys the will power, so hypnotizes and enslaves a man, so weakens and finally wrecks personality as this sin of gambling and betting.

A CURIOUS CASE TO BE REHEARD.

NEW YORK, Feb. 10.—An alrning in court is to be given to the case of Foulke E. Bandit. The sentence of thirty years imprisonment for burglary and assault committed in the home of Mortimore L. Scheff, here formerly he was not, arrested a number of interested parties one of whom was successful today in obtaining a writ of habeas corpus in the case.

After serving nearly five years of long term Brandt recently appealed in vain to Governor Dix for a pardon. The prisoner had asserted that he pleaded guilty to a crime which he did not commit in order to shelter the reputation of a woman in the Scheff household, and that at the time of the plea he was promised leniency, instead which he received a severe sentence.

JEALOUSY OF YOUNG WIFE BLEW OUT HIS BRAINS.

GRANBY, Que., Feb. 8.—After a bitter quarrel with his young wife, of whom he was insanely and unreasonably jealous, Charles Provost, forty-five years old, went to the barber shop yesterday and had his face carefully shaved and massaged, then he went to a hardware shop, asked the dealer for the very best revolver he had, with cartridges and going home, went to his room and blew out his brains.

ARBITRATION TREATIES UP IN U. S. SENATE.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 8.—The ratification of the pending arbitration treaties with Great Britain and France, though "lame and impotent as an obligation to peacefully settle disputes," was urged before the senate today by Senator Works of California. He declared that if the representatives of the three great powers had intended to exclude from the terms of the agreement every dispute that a nation was likely to go to war about, they could not have done it more effectually.

"Questions of national honor, so called, the Monroe Doctrine, the respective rights of the citizens of the contracting parties, and almost every other matter of dispute of any consequence is excluded from the effect of treaties by the definition of justiciable questions. As a declaration in favor of peace, the treaties are commendable, and as such I support them, as a means of settling disputes between nations in a way to avoid war they are almost wholly without force or merit."

Senator Works said that the United States government "was puffed up with the power and the wealth and consumed with the lust for more power and greater wealth." He declared that the government could remove the greatest obstacle to the attainment of peace and save millions of dollars of unnecessary expense by surrendering the "additional territory across the sea, acquired by little better than a sham naval battle followed by a course of deceit and intrigue.

"We have subjugated and held in practical slavery," he added, "a whole nation who are civilized and speaking a foreign tongue. We have taken over other countries and other peoples with no better reason or excuse. We have no right in law or equity to hold or interfere with the territory or liberty and independence of these people."

Senator Works advocated an alliance between the great powers to ostracize commercially and otherwise any nation that went to war and to bind themselves not to increase their armaments.
