LESSON HELPS.

16. "Eternal life"—The idea of eternal life seems to have been a slow growth in the mind of the Jew.

17. "Why callest thou me good"—Christ wanted to know whether the meant what he said, "None good"—Showing that Jesus was God if he was good.

"The commandments"—"The questioner is answered as from his own point of view. If eternal life was to be won by doing, there was no need to come to a new teacher for a new precept. It was enough to keep the Commandments, the great moral laws of God, as distinct from ordinances and traditions (Matt. 15. 3) with which every Israelite was familiar."—Plumptre.

20. "All these"—"The young man's reply testifies, undoubtedly, great moral ignorance, but also noble sincerity. He knows not the spiritual meaning of the commandments, and thinks that he has really fulfilled them."—Godet. "When the angel of death came for the Rabbi Chanina he said, 'Go and fetch me the Book of the Law, and see whether there is anything in it which I have not kept.'"

22. "Sorrowful"—How much did he not lose even as regards this world! Almost anybody can be a rich man. There are millions of rich men meaner than the meanest poverty can make them. But how few have the offer of being an apostle!"—Whedon. "He made, as Dante calls it, 'the great refusal.' And so he vanishes from the Gospel history; nor do the evangelists know anything of him farther."—Farar.

24. "It is easier, etc."—The eye of a needle is either the small door sometimes made in the city gates, called the needle's eye by the Arabs—large enough for a man but too small for a camel—or, rather, the oriental needle of burnished iron from two to five inches long, or their large ivory tape-needle."—Van Lennep. "Camel"—It is claimed by some authorities that this world should be translated "rope."

25. "Who then?"—"Like all Jews, they had been accustomed to regard worldly prosperity as a special mark of the favour of God."—Geikie. "To exclude the rich man from salvation was, it seemed, to exclude all; for if the most blessed among men can only be saved with difficulty, what will become of the rest?"—Godet.

26. "Are possible?"—"The salvation of a rich man is as miraculous as the putting of a camel through a needle's eye. It is a human impossibility. But God can do it."—Whedon.

NEW YORK CUSTOMS OFFICIALS DISCOVER

Large Quantity of Jewels in Miss Dorrance's Baggage.

NEW YORK, November 18.—On the arrival of the American line steamship New York to-day a squad of a special agents of the London and some secret service men hurried on board and asked to be shown the stateroom occupied by a woman who said her name was Miss M. Dorrance. She had left her room when the special agent reached it and had succeeded in having her three pieces of baggage passed. This consisted of two trunks and portmanteau all of which bore the chalk marks of the custom house officer who had passed them. The baggage was again overhauled and the chalk marks wiped off. Subsequently one trunk and portmanteau, were sent to a hotel. It was said that Miss Dorrance had brought in much new jewelry and about \$5,000 worth of unset diamonds had been sold to her by a Parisian firm. Miss Dorrance declined to discuss the seizure and treasury officials were equally reticent.

EPIDEMIC IN PEKIN.

Native Chinese Die of Smallpox Deplorable Sanitary Conditions.

PEKIN, November 18, Via Shanghai, November 18.—Sanitary conditions here becoming serious. Since the foreign occupation Chinese have died of smallpox and other infectious diseases. Fearing that their funerals would be interfered with, they have kept most of the coffins containing their dead in their houses and courtyards. The question of removing garbage has become one of the gravest importance. As the natives are forbidden to deposit refuse in the streets there is now an enormous accumulation in their dwellings, and yards which threatens a serious epidemic. In view of the large number of troops in and near the capital the consequence of such an outbreak would be frightful. Smallpox, which is always prevalent, is much more malignant during the winter season and the danger here most alarmingly increased.
