WEEKLY REVIEW OF THE STOCK MARKET.

Oct. 25th 1902
THE SITUATION.

General recessions were in order the first of the week as we advised you to expect. The settlement of the coal strike, and the announcement of the purchasing of bonds by the government, were taken advantage of by the professional element to sell stocks.

On the recessions there has been good buying by large manipulative interests while the trading element has been operating on the short side. The short interest is large and they will cover at materially higher prices after the elections are over. The strength of sterling exchange has caused some uneasiness, but it is doubtful if there will be any important shipments of gold until along in December. Railroad merger plans are nearing completion and when results are obtained stocks will be a great deal higher. The public are not in the market and they will not buy. The time will come when they will be clamoring for stocks 10 and 20 points above this level. Take advantage of recessions NOW and BUY STOCKS.

The immediate market will be a good trading one and many good profits can be made by buying on the recessions and taking two to three points profit. THE RAILROADS.

ST. PAUL reacted within a fraction of the point that we gave you to buy it and it has shown a strong undertone throughout the week. We advise its purchase around 192 and would sell it above 194 for a turn. It will eventually sell above 200 and stay there.

UNION PACIFIC has held its own. There has been considerable liquidation and the stock is now held in stronger hands than ever. Buy it around 105 and hold for a substantial profit.

BALTIMORE & OHIO has been bought in large lots by the "Gates contingent" and a deal is under way that will advance it to higher prices than have yet been reached. Purchases now made on a 5% margin should show some 10 points profit in the near future.

This same interest has been large buyers of NORFOLK & WESTERN. Action on the dividend will come next month and there is a probability of its being placed upon a 4% basis. An important advance is promised by manipulative interests and we advise its purchase at the market.

CHESAPEAKE & OHIO is another low priced stock that is due for much higher prices. A strong pool is now operating in it and it is the intention to advance it in 60s the coming month.

ATLANTIC is one of the cheapest stocks selling under 100. The Berwind pool have their original line of stock and there is a possibility of its being acquired by the Pennsylvania. Increased dividends are assured the coming year. Present purchasers will get the November dividends, and we advise buying the common stock for an investment and speculation. The preferred is cheap under 105.

LOUISVILLE & NASHVILLE has had a severe decline owing to the fears that the minority stockholders would be frozen out. We have made a careful investigation of the situation, and believe that they will be well taken care of, and L. & N. will again lead above 150. Insiders have steadily acquired this stock of late. A short interest of moderate dimensions has accumulated, and on any attempt to cover it will be marked up rapidly. We advise its purchase under 150.

M. K. & T. RREF., WABASH PREF., GREAT WESTERN, ST. LOUIS & SOUTHWESTERN, KANSAS CITY SOUTHERN and CHICAGO & ALTON will all bear watching and are safe purchases at ruling prices.

THE INDUSTRIALS.

Several pools have been formed of late to operate in this group and greater activity is promised. Aggressive buying has been noted in C. F. & I. supposed to be for control by contending interests. Our daily letter of October 23 advised of the movement, and it could have been bought around 85. We are advised that it will sell above 100. We advise buying at the market and on recessions. You will witness wide fluctuations in it with in the next 30 days.

HOCKING COAL & IRON is one of the cheapest of the low priced stocks. This company has provided largely by the increased demand for bituminous coal. A meeting of the directors will shortly be held, and a quarterly dividend of 1-2 of 1% is a possibility. They have a large cash surplus and have earned some 4% on the

stock. A merger is contemplated between the bituminous coal properties, and it is the plan to take over this stock on a basis of 40. We advise buying at the market and feel confident that if a little patience is exercised good profits will result.

The condition of the steel industry is most satisfactory. Mills are working at their full capacity and orders are booked for six months ahead. Owing to the shortage of steel rails, several railroad companies have had to go abroad for supplies. The Southern Pacific alone has recently bought 40,000 tons of steel rails in Europe. The U. S. Steel Co. show net earnings for the quarter ending September 30 of \$36,764,643. Judging from the excellent showing made it is expected that for the second fiscal year that the earnings will exceed \$140,000,000. Undivided profits for nine months amount to some \$35,000,000 with a total to date of some \$58,500,000, sufficient to pay dividends on the common stock at the rate of 4% for nearly three years to come. U. S. Steel Com. or Pref. have done nothing in the market for over a year. They will have their day, and we advise taking advantage of ruling prices to buy. They will advance from 20 to 30 points within the next year. We will carry them on a 5% margin.

The copper situation is still unsatisfactory but it will bear close watching. The time is not far hence when you will see important changes for the better. Copper stocks have been held back for a purpose, but ultimately they will pay large profits. A shake-out is likely before the boom starts. The public are long of AMALGAMATED, and there are large stop orders under 60. We advise getting out of long stock and await a break before buying.
