REPORT OF WOMEN'S INSTITUTES PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

Springton—Women's Institute held its regular monthly meeting at the home of Mrs. J. R. White, on the evening of February 2nd. The evening was taken up largely with a programme in which there were solos, duets, and recitations. Miss Daisy B. McNeill has been appointed secretary of the institute. It has been decided to take up sewing for the Hospital. This is the last institute which has been organized on the Island and already the women belonging to it show great enthusiasm for the work. Seven new members have been added to the institute since the last meeting.

Travellers Rest and Sherbrooke.—The regular monthly meeting of this institute was held at the home of Mrs. Geo. Pickering on the evening of January 20th. There were twenty members and a large number of visitors present. During the evening a report of the work of the twelve months was given. The remainder of the evening was taken up with dialogues, readings, recitations and quartettes. This institute has undertaken the making of quilts for the Orphanage. The next meeting will be held at the home of Mrs. Woodside, Sherbrooke.

Granville.—Women's Institute held its regular meeting at the home of Mrs. Peter Molsaer on the evening of January 24th. There were twenty present at this meeting. The holding of a dance for the purpose of raising funds for the starting of the Hot School Lunch was then discussed. This institute was organized only last December but the members are taking a keen interest in the improvement of school conditions in particular and the general improvement of the district.

Malpeque.—Institute held its regular meeting in the Institute Room on January 27th, there were twenty present. Five new books were added to the circulating library which has been commenced by the members. This institute has supplied the school with the cocoa, sugar and necessary equipment for the serving of the Hot School Lunch in the school. 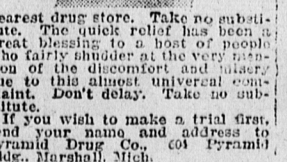
