**Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations.**

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or of any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of public land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or sub-Agency in the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$10 per acre. Duties: Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$2000.

**LARGE NUMBER ENTER PROVINCE.**

OTTAWA, Sept. 28—Detailed statement of the immigration into Canada for the last fiscal year has been issued in a summary of the Department's work. Interesting facts are brought out.

Last year's total arrivals of 146,908 brought the total immigration for the past twelve years up to 1,365,650.

Of this number 540,821 came from the United Kingdom, 425,412 from the United States and 400,617 from other countries.

**CANADIAN WHEAT OF GOOD QUALITY.**

OTTAWA, Sept. 28—From official figures proof is given as to the splendid quality of the wheat in the West. For the three weeks ending Sept. 21, there was inspected in the West 9,084 cars. Of this, 98 per cent. graded high, 110 cars graded one hard, and 4,580 cars one northern.

During the same period last year, 6,530 cars were inspected, of which barely 70 per cent was good enough to put in the three higher grades.

**A FAST STEAMSHIP LINE.**

TORONTO, Sept. 28—That a faster line of steamers must run from St. John or Halifax to the West Indies, and a better distributing service be established before Canada's trade will improve, were the main suggestions offered the West Indies Royal Commission.

**BLACK HAND CAUSES PANIC.**

NEW YORK, Sept. 28—Terrorified by Black Hand stories, one thousand children stampeded in the Polish Parochial school, Jersey City, when fireworks were set off in the street below, and in the mad rush for the doors, fourteen were crushed, one so severely that death will result.

The school house is a stone's throw from the Italian Church which obtained a permit to set off fireworks during a Church celebration.

A rumor last week among the children that threats had been made to blow up the schools with dynamite. The children from St. Anthony's had been particularly nervous and when the bombs went off suddenly, they ran shrieking into the halls. The terrified children rushed wildly down stairs. Several of the smaller children were trampled under foot into unconsciousness, while others ran back into the building and sprang through the open windows.

John Balderston, the latter of whom, a life long neighbor, spoke in highest terms of both Mr. and Mrs. Easter and family. Very affectionate letters were also read from absent members of the family in the far West and New England states. Music and singing passed away the remainder of the evening, which closed by all singing "God be with you till we meet again."
