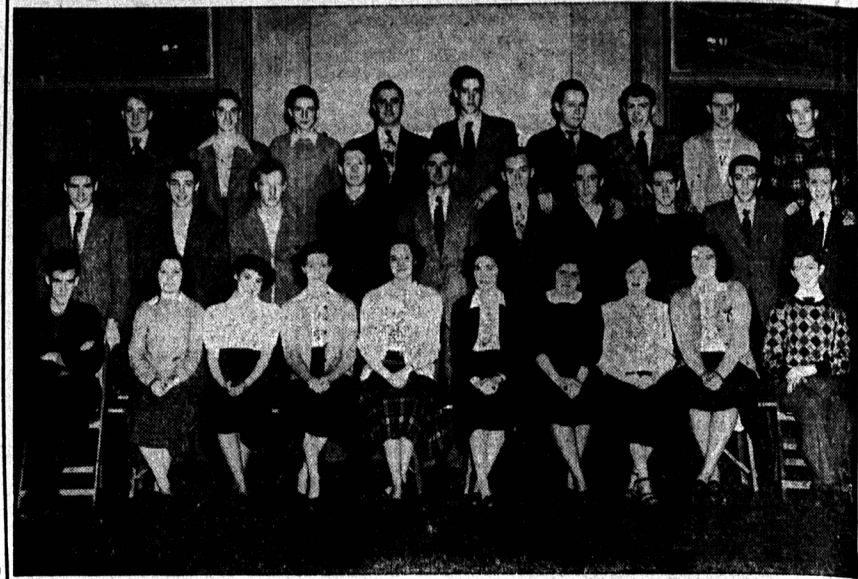

NEW DRUG FOR COWS LONDON, March 13 — (AP) — British researchers have discovered a new drug, nisin, similar to penicillin but more effective in treating a cow disease which costs Britain 40,000,000 gallons of milk a year. The National Institute for Research in Dairying announced the discovery is expected to combat mastitis, an inflammation of the milk glands.
