Livestock

MONTREAL, Nov. 26—(CP)—The Dominion Livestock Branch reported today there were 271 cattle, 275 sheep and lambs, 1,132 hogs and 247 calves for sale on the two Montreal livestock markets.
Prices on all classes of livestock were steady.
There were no top steers. Common steers were \$6 to \$6.50. Good heifers \$6 to \$6.50, and common as low as \$3.50. A good fed calf brought \$10.50. Good cows made \$5.25 to \$5.50 with medium from \$4.50 to \$5 and common butchers down to \$3.75. Canners and cutters were \$2.50 to \$3.50. Common bulls \$3.50 to \$4.50 and good bulls \$5 to \$5.50 with one at \$6.
Veal calves ranged from 8.50 to \$11. Drinkers \$5.25 to \$8 and grassers \$4.25 to \$5 mostly \$4.50 to \$4.75. Good ewes and weathers were \$10. Culls and bucks \$8 and sheep \$3.50 to \$6.
Hogs were unchanged at \$10.85 for B-2's, \$9.25 for B-1's, alive fed and watered and up to \$8.35 off trucks. Grade A drew \$1 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Sows were \$4.75 to \$5.50.

FINANCE

NEW YORK, Nov. 26—(AP)—Selective rallying power was present in today's stock market.
In Canada in the Canadian section included Walkers, Ford and Imperial Oil. International Nickel and Hollinger were easy.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was unchanged at 44.5. Volume picked up to 893,170 shares from 821,260 the day before which was the smallest turnover for a 5-hour stretch since Oct. 28.
Air transportation company stocks such as American Airlines, Eastern Air Lines and United Air Lines dropped 1-2 1-2 points in the final hour when it was learned the War Department had appealed to the priorities board to suspend construction of passenger carrying planes because of interference with war craft building.
Republic Steel directors, for instance, declared a dividend of 40 cents a share on the common, first payment on the junior stock since 1939, but the issue closed unchanged at 22 5-8. Norfolk and Western, bluest of "blue chips" on the "big board" voted a \$5 extra on the common which put the year's disbursements on this stock at \$15, the same as paid in 1939. The shares were up 2 3-4 points at 225 on a single sale.
Stocks finishing in front included U.S. Rubber common and preferred, Youngstown Sheet, American Can, Westinghouse, Kennecott, Standard Oil of N.J., Great Northern, Allied Chemical, Johns-Manville, Montgomery Ward, Sears Roebuck and American-Hawaiian Steamship.
International Paper preferred dipped when directors neglected to act on a much-talked of dividend. Other losers were U.S. Steel, Bethlehem, Chrysler, General Motors, Santa Fe, N.Y. Central, Douglas Aircraft, Consolidated Edison, American Smelting and Western Union.

NEW YORK, Nov. 26—(CP)—The Swiss franc gained 1 cent at 23.22 cents against United States funds in a narrow foreign exchange market today.
The free pound sterling at \$4.04 and the Canadian dollar at a discount of 12 16-16 per cent, closed unchanged. (Ottawa Foreign Exchange Control Board rate 9.69-9.91 per cent discount.)
The Argentine peso advanced 1 cent to 23.61 cents while the Hong Kong and Shanghai dollar lost .05 and .02 of a cent respectively.

International Paper preferred showed an upward adjustment of four points and Power Corporation and Shawinigan boasted small gains. Smelters and Hudson Bay closed slightly higher while Nickel and Petroleum eased somewhat.
Issues to finish higher included Tobacco preferred, Seagraves, Ogilvie and Associated Breweries while backward were Steamers preferred, Celanese and Wabasco.
