

PLANT RAILROAD SYSTEM.

SAVANNAH, Sept. 29.—Some time ago the Plant system of railroads made its return for taxation. The state comptroller declined to accept the valuation returned by the company and made a new assessment, fixing the taxation value at \$757,143 above the amount fixed by the company.

The board reached a conclusion today, the salient feature of which is that the Plant property is to be assessed for approximately \$900,000 less than the comptroller demanded and \$130,000 less than the company's original return.

THE BRITISH ELECTIONS.

The Parliament now being elected in the United Kingdom is the fifteenth since the Queen came to the throne. When Her Majesty succeeded to the crown the two great parties were known as Whigs and Tories, the former being in power.

In the contest now going on too much reliance must not be placed in the preponderance of Conservatives returned by acclamation and in the earlier contests. The elections in the counties where the agricultural and mining vote predominates, have yet to be heard from, and it is significant that the great annual Trades Union Congress just held passed a vote of condemnation against the Government.

The reconstructed New Brunswick cabinet has been able to secure the return of its new Ministers, Hon. Dr. Pugsley the Attorney General, and Hon. Lauchlin Farris, the Commissioner of Agriculture, by largely increased majorities.

Mr. Hetherington, the Conservative candidate who unsuccessfully opposed Hon. Mr. Farris in Queen's County, N. B., at the election of Tuesday, has obtained quite a wide notoriety in that province for his outspoken denunciation of alleged "French domination."

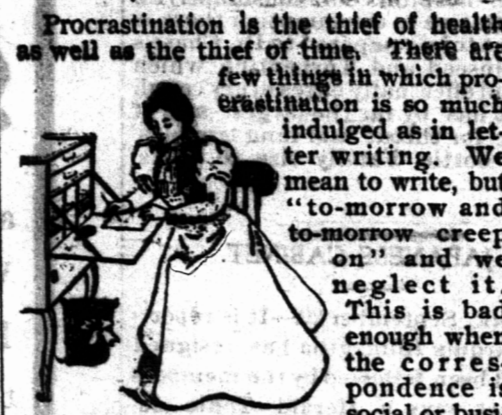
