PECTIN FROM ORANGE PEEL Can pectin for home use be made from orange peel? A solution, one quart of water to one teaspoonful of cream of tartar. But do not use this on colors unless the dye is desired to bleach the goods.

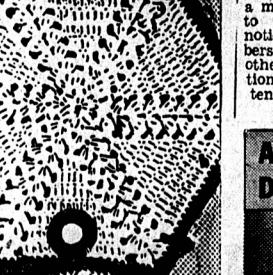
