IN MEMORIAM

HILDA FOLEY
 The death occurred at Bloomfield on Tuesday, May 31st, of Hilda, eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Alonzo Foley at the age of 18 years, and the sad affair has cast a gloom over the entire community and the sympathy of all goes out to the bereaved family in their hour of trial and sorrow rendered doubly severe from the fact that only a few short weeks before their youngest child, a bright little boy of six years, was suddenly called away and while their hearts were sad and lonely for the loss of their dear one they were again visited by death and their eldest daughter claimed for its victim. The deceased had been in delicate health for some time, but great hopes were entertained for her recovery, but despite the best medical skill and tender nursing she gradually sank until the end came. Although her stay on earth was brief she made many friends, for her kind and cheerful manner endeared her to all who had the pleasure of her acquaintance and she will long be remembered in the community, as she was a universal favorite with both young and old, and many tears of regret will be shed by her youthful companions when their thoughts revert to the past and recall the many kind deeds rendered to them in one way or another by their departed friend. She leaves to mourn besides her grief-stricken parents, four brothers and three sisters, to all of whom the most sincere sympathy is extended. 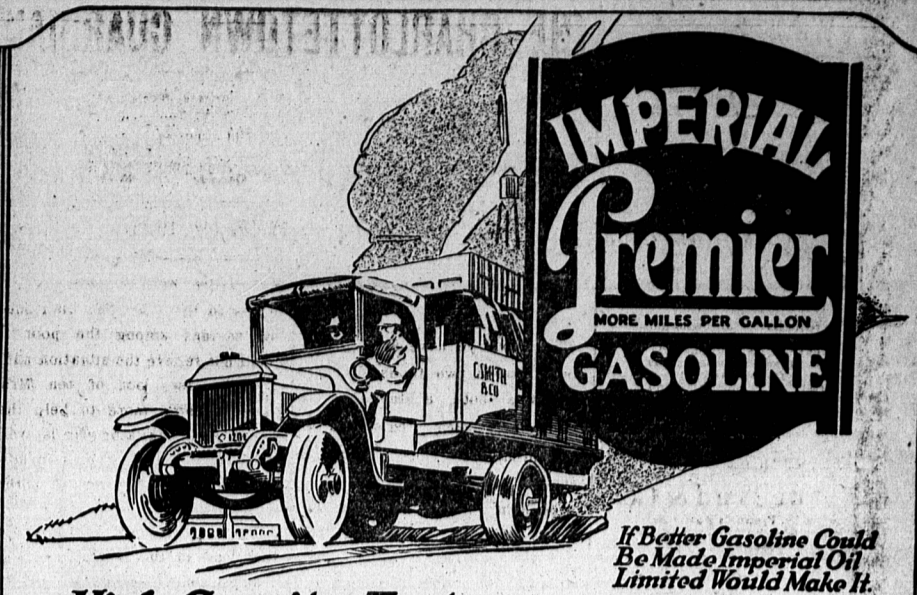
