Cook's Corner

LACY OATMEAL COOKIES

These are very quick to make and need little sugar.

1 egg
1 cup of rolled oats
1/2 teaspoon of vanilla
Salt
1/2 cup of sugar

Beat the egg and then add the sugar and vanilla and salt and stir in the rolled oats. Sometimes if you have used a big egg you have to add a little more than a cupful.

Grease a baking sheet and put spoonfuls of the mixture on it flatter out with a fork. The cookies should be spread so thin that there are almost holes in them. Bake in a 375 degrees oven for about ten minutes. Sometimes if light brown and remove from the baking sheet with the egg lifter. Do this while they are still hot because if you don't you won't ever get them off except with steel wool.

The questions are those which have reached the Wartime Prices and Trade Board from housewives in this region. The answers are provided by the Board Readers. Persons who have intelligent questions to ask on price control are invited to send them in writing to the Women's Regional Advisory Committee.

Q. Are blouses displayed in windows supposed to have a price tag in evidence.

A. A blouse which is on display in a window need not have a price tag in evidence, but if this garment or one similar is shown to a customer or on display in a store the garment must have a price tag on it which the customer may easily read.

Q. Should grapefruit displayed in a store have prices showing?

A. Yes. Grapefruit displayed in a store must have the size of the grapefruit and the price shown clearly.

Q. Are canned peas under a price ceiling? They seem to vary in price.

A. Yes. Canned peas are under a price ceiling. Peas vary as to price according to the grade, and they may vary slightly in price from district to district. This has always been the case.

Q. Are there any places where high-heeled shoes for women are inappropriate?

A. They certainly are not appropriate for hiking or for the golf links. And lower heels are also much better for the business office.

Q. Which is preferable, "Only a few people were present," or "only a few persons"?

A. Use persons when referring to a large number.

Q. Is it good form for one to use initials on a visiting card?

A. The proper form is to have the name appear in full.

Arguments Ruin Marriages

Couple Would Do Well Not To Quarrel Over Trivials

DEAR MISS DIX: My husband and I are in a perpetual fight. We can't agree on anything. We start out on an evening's entertainment and before we know it we are in a hot argument about where to go, where to eat and what to do, and we have had a perfectly horrid time. Both of us are mad and bitter.

We have tried to discuss our misunderstandings in an intelligent manner, but all attempts have resulted in failure and led to further arguments. So we are turning to you for help.

ANSWER: The arguing habit is like the drink habit, and like the drink habit there is just one cure for it, and that is to quit it. Stop it. Take a solemn oath that you will never indulge in an argument on any subject, no matter how much you are tempted, nor how good an opening you see to get in your little two cents' worth of objections.

FUTILITY OF ARGUMENTS

When you think of it, you must realize that absolutely the most foolish thing that any couple can do is to ruin a perfectly good marriage, break up a home that otherwise would be happy, orphan little children, if there are any youngsters, and deal yourself a heart wound that will never heal for the sake of differing in opinion with someone else about a matter that is really of no importance.

Take the instance you cite in your letter. If your husband wants to go to a restaurant while you prefer another, is it worth ruining his evening by getting into a quarrel over it? Why not say "fine" and make the occasion a pleasant one instead of a brawl? If he likes one kind of a movie and you like another, why not compromise? If your political opinions differ from your husband's, keep your views to yourself and let him rave. He will soon run down because it takes two to keep an argument going.

A man who has made a study of this subject says that any argument can be prevented, or stopped, by the simple expedient of saying: "There is much in what you say." Or "It is an interesting point of view you have." That leaves you free to think and do as you please, with no harsh words said and no bones broken.

And here is a tip that is worth every wife's taking: Most men argue because they feel somehow that by asserting their own opinion they are showing that they are the head of the house. If the wife doesn't combat this attitude, they abandon it, because they really do not care anything about the subject itself. Try out these suggestions and see if they don't work.

DEAR MISS DIX: In our community there is a group of teenagers who go out to dances and parties in a small truck. Some mothers disapprove of a petition to forbid children under 18 to be out after nine o'clock. I don't see why it is any more wrong for us to go out in a truck than it would be in a car. Do you?

ANSWER: I don't either. I don't see why a truck isn't as moral a conveyance as a Rolls Royce would be. On the contrary, I am all in favor of the truck because it wouldn't offer such opportunities for parking and petting. You kids would more or less chaperone each other.

But I do think that in all such parties there should be a mother or two included who could look after your youngsters and see that you behaved yourselves.

Teen-agers are at the playtime of life. They are full of animal spirits and they want to dance and sing and eat and make merry, and their parents make a mistake when they try to suppress these natural instincts. What they should see to is that they have plenty of good clean fun, instead of having to take their pleasures secretly and in hidden ways. And the youngsters will not resent supervision if it is done sympathetically. On the contrary, they like it, because they know that they are ignorant of many of the rules of the game and they like to have somebody who is older and wiser to counsel everybody under the age of 18 into the house and put out the lights and lock the door by nine o'clock is making a mistake.
