Mr. Nicholson is enjoying splendid health, and still takes a keen interest in business and public affairs. He has had a long and honourable record in public life dating away back to 1896 when he entered the City Council, and was appointed chairman of the Citizens' Committee which secured the passing of a bill providing for the splendid water works system we now enjoy. He also, along with Mr. James Paton, advocated and had introduced permanent sidewalks, and our modern drainage system. From 1904 to 1911 he was chairman of the Water Commission and guided it through the difficult years of its existence. In the latter year he was chosen a Conservative candidate to represent Queen's along with Mr. A. & Mc enjoy his "dolls far niente."

Learn, K. C., and was elected, being re-elected in 1917, having obtained 98 p. c. of the soldiers' vote overseas at the time.
