SOMETHING FUNNY ABOUT THIS POLL.

QUEBEC, March 1.—Claiming irregularities in one of the polls where there were more ballots in the box than votes cast, Mr. Cloutier, who was defeated for No. 1 seat in Limoulin Ward by Mr. Lamontagne, on Monday last, presented a petition to Justice Gagne yesterday asking for a recount of ballots. The judge granted the request. The recount will be made on Monday.

In St. Roch's Ward at Poll No. 58 the deputy returning officer having forgotten to give a statement of the votes cast, the city clerk has called the four candidates, their representatives and the deputy returning officer, who will be examined under oath Saturday on the final result of the poll.

THE BRITISH SITUATION.

LONDON, March 1.—Despite the Premier's denial, he asked the King indirectly for a guarantee that the Lords not be permitted indefinitely to block Liberal legislation.

This the King refused to give, expressing doubt whether the country has signified a wish for drastic treatment of the Lords.

Mr. Asquith's Government has obtained leave of life until next Easter. This was the gift of the Conservatives who are so anxious to avoid two general elections successively, within so brief a time, that they accepted the Premier's programme without calling for a vote.

When the Commons meets, after Easter, it will take up the struggle to revolutionize the British Government system.

Resolutions are to be presented to deprive the Lords of authority over the finances, and also of the power of vetoing the measures of the Lower House—leaving to the Lords only the functions of delay and discussion.

TORONTO, Feb. 28.—While addressing a meeting in St. Mary's College, Toronto, Saturday afternoon, Mrs. John Hoodless, of Hamilton, dropped dead. She was a prominent member of the Women's Council of Canada.

STEAMER DAMAGED IN \$75,000 FIRE AT BOSTON WHARF

BOSTON, Feb. 28.—A stubborn fire (daily today) at the Clyde Line freight sheds on Lewis wharf gave the department a hard three-hour fight and caused a loss of approximately \$75,000.

The steamer Onondaga which was tied up at the wharf, caught fire about the upper deck and but for the prompt work of the fire-boat and of the crews of several tugs, which pulled the steamer into midstream, the vessel would have been destroyed. Some of the tow-boats were slightly burned in the work of salvage. The main loss by the fire was on the cargo of miscellaneous goods that had just been discharged by the Onondaga.

The blaze started from an unknown cause in the one-story shed on the end of Lewis wharf and quickly spread.

DISTINGUISHED OTTAWA INVALIDS GO SOUTH FOR THEIR HEALTH

OTTAWA, Feb. 28.—Hon. L. P. Brodeur has so far recovered his health that he was able to leave on Saturday evening with Madam Brodeur for "Pinehurst," South Carolina, where he will remain for a couple of weeks in hopes of regaining his lost strength. Hon. Geo. P. Cahoon accompanied the minister and his wife as far as New York.

Lady Laurier, who has been ailing for some time past, left tonight for Hot Springs (Ark.), where she will remain for several weeks. She was accompanied by Senator Melvin Jones, of Toronto, and Mrs. Jones.

TWO BROCTON FIREMEN INJURED, ONE FATALLY IN AUTO SMASH-UP

BROCTON, Mass., Feb. 28.—Call Fireman William L. Hanchett, of the Brocton fire department, today was probably fatally injured and second assistant Chief H. Moore was painfully hurt when the automobile which Chief Marston was driving at high speed crashed into a telephone pole on West Chestnut street. The chief was also cut and bruised. Hanchett sustained a concussion of the brain and Moore, a fracture of his left knee. Both were taken to the Brocton Hospital, where Hanchett was placed on the dangerous list. The automobile was almost completely demolished.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head, of a family or any male over 18 years old, may hereinafter acquire a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Homesteads—six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead, at \$10 per acre. But he must reside six months in each of six years from date of his most recent entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$100 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
