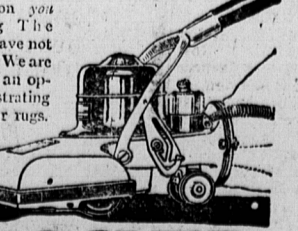

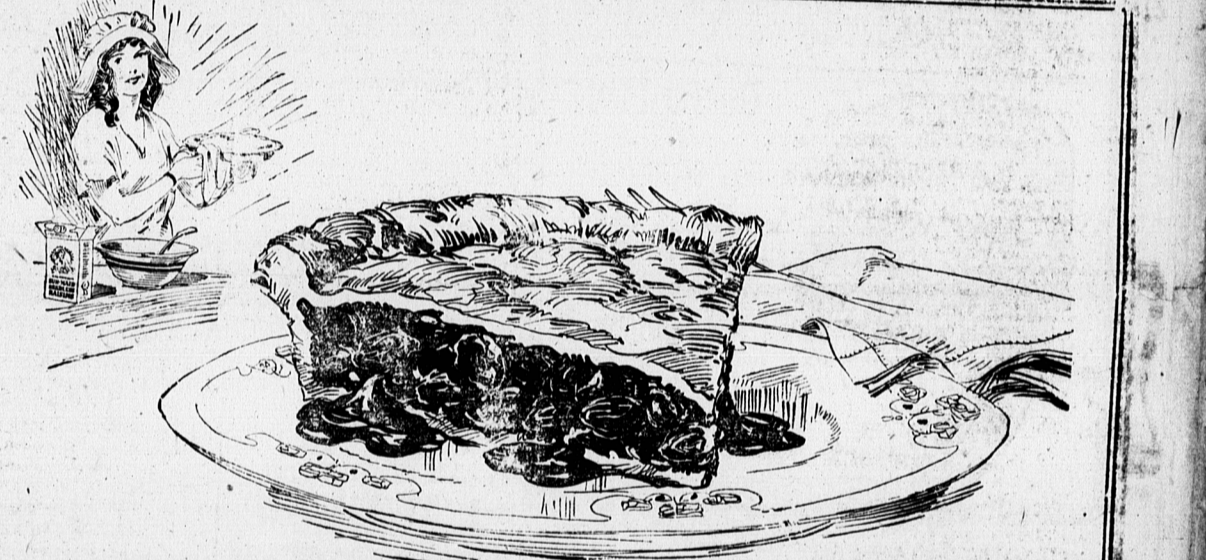

TRY THREE from the four or all of them STEWED RAISINS

Cover Sun-Maid Raisins with cold water and add a slice of lemon or orange to each half pound. Place on fire; bring to a boil and allow to simmer for one hour. Sugar may be added, but is not necessary, as Sun-Maid Seeded Raisins contain 75 per cent natural fruit sugar. Serve with or without cream.

RAISIN RICE PUDDING
1/2 cup Sun-Maid Seeded Raisins
1 1/2 cups rice
2 eggs
1 cup water
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup butter
1/2 cup raisins (may omit)

Wash rice and place in double boiler with 1 cup water. Cook until water is absorbed. Add 2 cups milk, 1/2 cup sugar, 1/2 cup butter, 1/2 cup raisins, 1/2 cup milk and the remaining 1/2 cup water. Add the sugar, combine with rice and raisins, pour into pudding dish, set in pan of hot water and bake until custard is set.

RAISIN PIE
2 cups Sun-Maid Seeded Raisins
2 cups cold water
4 tablespoons corn starch
1 teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons sugar
2 tablespoons lemon juice
1/2 teaspoon grated lemon rind.

Cover raisins with one cup water and bring slowly to boiling point. Mix corn starch, salt and sugar with remaining cup water and add to boiling raisins, stirring constantly. Allow to boil ten minutes. Add lemon juice and rind and pour into pastry lined pie pan. Cover with meringue. Put into very hot oven, decreasing the heat after ten minutes of baking. Bake until brown.

RAISIN SALAD
1 cup Sun-Maid Seeded Raisins
1/2 cup lemon juice
2 cups shredded apples or pears
2 cups shredded lettuce
1 cup cream mayonnaise

Wash and dry the raisins, add to the apples and lemon juice. Toss well or mix with shredded lettuce, apple and pears in center, cover with mayonnaise, serve with fresh salad, cheese balls and cranberry sauce. Small pieces of red tart jelly, decorated lettuce in a mixture of butter, will go further and decorate lettuce if shredded.
