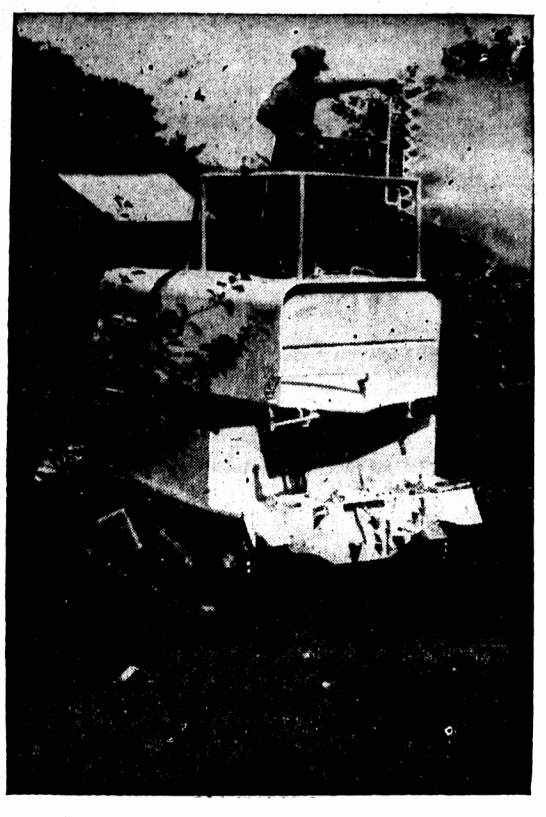

**Yanks Just One Game Out Of Third Place**  
With Paul (Dizzy) Trout pitching ball for the first five innings and scattering four singles over the distance, Detroit Tigers shut out Cleveland Indians for the second straight time, 9-0, to sweep their three-game American League series. Chapman's outstanding catch of Charlie Keller's fly in the top of the eighth with three Yanks on base stopped a Yankee threat.

**Hog Production Shows Less Decline**  
OTTAWA, Sept. 6 (CP)—The number of hogs on farms in Canada, declining since December, 1945, for August this year to 3,377,300 from 6,025,600 at June 1, 1945, and 7,741,000 at June 1, 1944, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reported today.  
However, the bureau said the downward trend was beginning to level off, as indicated by the outside decline in sows expected to farrow—507,900 at June 1 this year compared with 512,500 on the same date last year.

**DUTCH MAKE BIG AERIAL RECOVERY**  
AMSTERDAM, Sept. 9 (CP)—Holland has not only restored Dutch Air services but multiplied them.  
The end of the war saw the Royal Dutch Air Lines without a serviceable airplane, few planes and no trained staff.  
Fourteen months later, K. L. M. (Koninklijk Luchtvaart Maatschappij, Royal Dutch Air Lines) services are manned by more planes and personnel, fly more miles and bring in more money than at any time before the war.  
Temporary wooden huts house offices, at Schiphol Airport, outside Amsterdam. Twisted skeletons of the Germans left of a once-modern station. Even the runways had to be re-surfaced before Allied service planes could use the field after the war.  
K. L. M. hires 300 new persons a month as plans progressively reach implementation. Before the end of the war its staff numbered 1,900. Today its 3,000 includes 132 pilots, 60 stewards and 40 stewardesses.  
Where, before the war, there were 36 planes there are 55 today and the pre-war total of daily miles flown—21,000—exceeds 55,000.  
K. L. M.'s regular services include two weekly flights from Amsterdam to New York, four runs weekly from Amsterdam to Batavia, and daily hops to Malmo, Stockholm, Zurich, Prague, Brussels, Paris, Oslo and London. A new service goes to Madrid and Lisbon, and is to be extended to Buenos Aires.

**FARES TO PROVIDE LINK WITH DENMARK**  
GLASGOW, Scotland, Sept. 9 (CP)—One of the most hazardous air routes in the northern hemisphere has been inaugurated between nearby Prestwick and the Faroe Islands, 200 miles northwest of the Shetlands.  
Intended to link the islands with Denmark, to which they belong, planes making the trip have first to return to Prestwick to refuel as there are no facilities on the islands.  
The Isles are almost constantly shrouded by cloud and the one airfield is hemmed in by mountains.
