For the past ten days considerable open water has been seen beyond the board ice of Alberton harbour.

C. B. Strong, whose visit to friends in Alberton had been much extended by the prolonged railway blockade, has returned to Summerside.

Owing to the impassable condition of the roads for weeks past only a very small quantity of mussel-mud has thus far been lifted from Mill River. This mud is of an excellent quality and if weather permits digging operations will be in full force during the present month.

In the Presbyterian Hall, Alberton on Friday night 3rd inst., Rev. Mr. Hamilton "delighted a fairly large audience with an extended lecture, the topic of which was "Readings on the Bonnie Brier Bush." The lecture was an interesting one and contained much information on Scottish folklore.

The death occurred at Portage on Monday, February 28th, of Miss Adeline McDonald after an illness of two months. The funeral services were held at St. Bridget's Church, Lot 11, on Wednesday morning and interment took place at R. C. Cemetery, Rev. F. L. Connolly officiating at the solemn service. While in the bloom of youth Miss McDonald has been called away. Her illness though brief was a most painful one and the Messenger of Death came not unexpected. The deceased leaves to mourn a grief-stricken father, mother and sister residing at Portage and three brothers living in the United States, to all of whom the sympathy of the community is extended.

Tignish Balls have always been renowned for their excellence and success, and this one was certainly up to the high standard of such previous occasions. Never before have the eclat of Tignish taken a more animated interest in such social events as during the present winter and none more fully enjoy "tripping the light fantastic" than the youth and beauty of Tignish. On the night of 3rd inst. it is the intention of the C. M. B. A. of Tignish to hold a grand St. Patrick's concert, at which an Irish drama will be played.

Once more, after what has appeared like months of an intermission, the familiar sound of the engine is heard on the still, frosty air, dully, bitterly cold and relentless February has passed; the delicate yet more lenient winds of March now beat upon one's brow and are wafted over a landscape, coldly white, sombre yet strangely spectacular; and slowly the Far West emerges from its prolonged cessation caused by the long continued siege of storms, biting cold and remorseless, and by degrees reawakens to its usual activity. But still winter's chilly embrace envelopes us for almost every house and building in and surrounding the town yet remain enshrouded behind barriers of snow and mounds of "the beautiful" piled in shapeless confusion and dishevelled masses which meet the eye in every direction. Yet, overhead, the sky has assumed a deeper azure, and as the eye is cast upward, the innumerable clouds seem to grow less torpid and the silent, flickering stars to shed a softer and more tender gleam upon Mother Earth. The sun also is daily adding a gayer refugence to the sky and its tepid rays stream downward with caressing tenderness. Even the aspens and stately maples, in their silent rigidity, seem to repeat a less mournful dirge as if sighing for the song of the birds and the advent of the joyous vernal season.

Dr. F. J. Hogan left here on Thursday for Tisdale, North Saskatchewan at which place he will pursue his professional calling. Many will read of the Doctor's departure with deep disappointment, and it is also with much regret that the popular Doctor severed his connection with the people of Alberton. Being of a whole-souled, kind and animated nature and of a most courteous disposition, he has not failed since coming to Alberton last August, to win for himself hosts of friends whose highest esteem and best wishes for his future success go with him on his regrettable departure from here.

During the prolonged Railway blockade, which was doubtless without precedence in the history of Island railroading, the mails arrived by stage to Alberton, which was the only delivering Office west of Conway, on the following dates: Feb. 10th, 15th, 18th, 22nd, 25th and March 2nd, 3rd and 4th. From Feb. 7th until March 3rd, both inclusive, only one mail was dispatched by regular train. During this interval only eight mails, with the above interruptions, reached Alberton by stage, Courier McKenzie meeting the Summerside courier at Mt. Pleasant and conveying the mail to Alberton. From here the mails were driven by Courier Route to St. Louis, De Blois and Tignish.
