WELDS SCIENCE WITH INDUSTRY

CANBERRA, April 1.—(CP)—A technical information service is to be inaugurated in Australia, according to an announcement made by R. G. Casey, minister in charge of scientific and industrial research.

This service is another step in the federal government's program to provide research facilities for secondary industries and to supply information on the application of science to industry.

C. A. Cook, formerly assistant secretary to the council for scientific and industrial research and editor of several periodicals, has been appointed officer in charge. A chemical engineer and an engineering physicist are also to be appointed.

The service will comprise three main branches: the information service; the editing of publications; and a library. It will prepare bibliographical references and abstracts of scientific papers, accompanied in appropriate form by summaries of information and technical information in response to inquiries by persons engaged in industry, and will furnish advice to persons who experience difficulties in manufacturing processes or the establishment of new industries.

It will publish information in non-scientific terms, explaining the results of researches undertaken by the council for scientific and industrial research, and will generally keep in close touch with scientific work being carried out within the Empire and elsewhere.

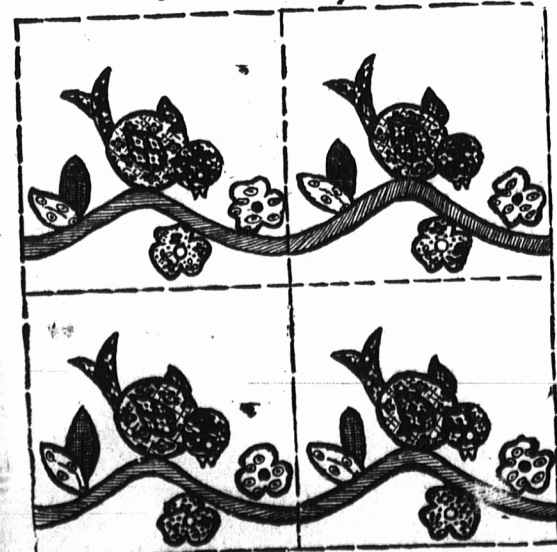
