THE HOME-COMING CONTINGENT.

Admiral Bedford at Halifax has intimated his desire to assist in making the arrival of the home-coming Canadian soldiers a memorial epoch in Canadian history. Three warships will be in port when the troopship Idaho arrives, and can supply 800 blue jackets to join in the demonstration which the military and enthusiastic citizens will make in honor of the returning braves. The three fishery protection cruisers are expected to arrive home from Newfoundland about the same time and may join in the reception.

From Charlottetown it has been proposed that a contingent of the Artillery with the band shall proceed to meet the Island boys at Pictou or Halifax and escort them home. There is also a movement talked of to secure the Government steamer "Minto" to bring home the Island boys, thus signalling the public estimate of their services to Queen and country. Down to the time of this writing we have not learned of definite arrangements being made in that regard, but Sir Louis has signified his desire to aid in giving all possible public honor to the returning soldiers.

It would be most desirable if it could be so arranged that the boat with the returning Islanders should reach this port at an early hour in the evening, when most of our people have finished the labors of day and can join in extending that hearty welcome which every true Islander feels in his heart and would desire to express. If all goes well the boys will be heartily and joyously welcomed home.

There can be no doubt that had railways never existed we should have far better wagon roads than we now have. The introduction of iron rails and steam locomotives caused the wagon routes to be too much neglected. Now the bicycle and the automobile have given a new impetus to the better roads movement. It is even proposed to construct a trans-continental wagon road from Boston, through Albany, Rochester, Buffalo, Cleveland and Chicago to San Francisco. The projector, a Mr. Martin Dodge, is endeavoring to interest the wheelmen's and automobile associations as well as the politicians in his project, which includes a high class carriage way with a side path for bicyclists, from ocean to ocean.

The war in South Africa was begun on Kruger's birthday, a year ago today. And today Gen. Cronje, whom the Canadians helped to capture at Paardeburg is celebrating Oom Paul's birthday at St. Helena. There are some 5,000 other Boers prisoners on the lonely isle to assist in the celebration. There are 16,000 more in South Africa. The Boer Republics have ceased to exist and have been added to the British Empire. Could Kruger have foreseen what a year would bring forth he would have celebrated his birthday last year in some other fashion than invading British territory.

It is highly pleasing to learn that India has now abundant rain, that crop prospects are good and that the number of persons receiving famine relief, though still large, is considerably less than one half of what it was.

Western Australia, which held out against joining the new Commonwealth, has now consented to come in and share its fortunes from the the federal beginning.

The new bridge to be constructed across the St. Lawrence at Quebec will be 15 feet higher than the Brooklyn bridge and several hundred feet longer than the famous Tay bridge.

Manitoba's imports and exports taken together increased from \$4,824,721 in 1897 to \$10,560,539 in 1900. The next year's showing will not be so good, owing to the drought in the growing season and the continued rains during harvest.

The recent Boer occupation of Rouxville, Wepener and other small places in the southeastern part of the Orange River Colony was short-lived, all having since been re-occupied by British troops. It is announced that Gen. Buller has reached Natal on his way home to England. This may mean that Lord Kitchener will remain in command of South Africa.

Cape Colony evidently suffered several during the Boer invasion and the military operations necessary to drive out the enemy's forces. The Cape Legislature has made an appropriation of half a million pounds sterling (nearly two million five hundred thousand dollars) toward paying one half these losses as now estimated. This money will be raised by loan. Large as is the sum it is small compared with the cost of maintaining the entire militia force of the colony on a war footing, and supplying them with arms, equipment and food for a year. Both Cape Colony and Natal will feel for many years to come the burden which the war entailed upon them. The Dominion has been most fortunate in escaping the great peril and cost to which sister colonies have been thus exposed.
