CHARLOTTETOWN AND THE WINTER STEAMERS.

Among the causes of satisfaction a fair excuse for the Minto plying from and to that port when the Straits are much obstructed by ice. There is also the shipping business and travel to and from King's County to be considered. But if there were no available port at the eastern end of the Island we cannot imagine that the winter steamer service would be abandoned, and our people forced to return to the ice-boat service at the Capes.

THE SYSTEM OF WATER SUPPLY AND SEWERAGE.

Some discussion has arisen over the system of sewerage in this city, as is quite natural and proper at a time when the Commissioners must be selected, or others chosen in their stead. There are those who would prefer the open system, in which the surface drainage is turned into the sewers at the street corners. With this the Commissioners have nothing at all to do, as the closed system was adopted when the sewers were laid down and, as we believe, wisely so.

Had the open system been adopted, the sewers must have been made very much larger and consequently much more costly, while the cost of pumping would have been multiplied many fold. Nor is this all. The open system has several other disadvantages. Among these are the danger of overflow in time of a down-pour of rain, with consequent backing of the sewage into houses, and also the escape of disease-breeding odors from the open catch-basins at the street corners.

Much of the filth of the streets is washed into these catch basins during rain-storms or by the melting snows in the spring. This filth has to be frequently removed by being scooped out with long-handled spoon shovels, thrown on the street and carted away. Needless to say the process is a mal-odorous one, so much so that prudent householders avoid taking residence or shop near a catch basin. But this by the way.

THE SMELT INDUSTRY.

Those engaged in smelt shipping from Prince Edward Island to New York complain of intolerable delays of ten to twelve days on the way. The mild weather of the past week has increased the trouble. Unless the fish are kept in refrigerator cars in such weather they cannot arrive in

good condition. And the express charges are felt to be exorbitant. The Guardian is informed that a meeting of shippers will be shortly held to arrange, if possible with the Express Company for lower rates and quicker transit by refrigerator cars. The industry is an important one which the transportation authorities should encourage in every way.

The contract with the Anglo-American Telegraph Company has been renewed on the old basis for one year. There is said to be some prospect that within that time the company's right may be bought out and with a new cable a combined telegraph and telephone service established across the straits.

Hon. R. W. Scott, the veteran author of the Canada Temperance Act, has introduced in the Senate a stringent bill to prohibit the carrying of intoxicating liquors for sale into any Province, County or municipality where the sale of liquors is prohibited by law. It is understood that Hon. A. B. Aylesworth, Minister of Justice has endorsed the principle of the bill, which it is hoped may become law.

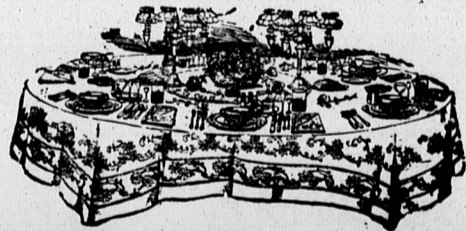
