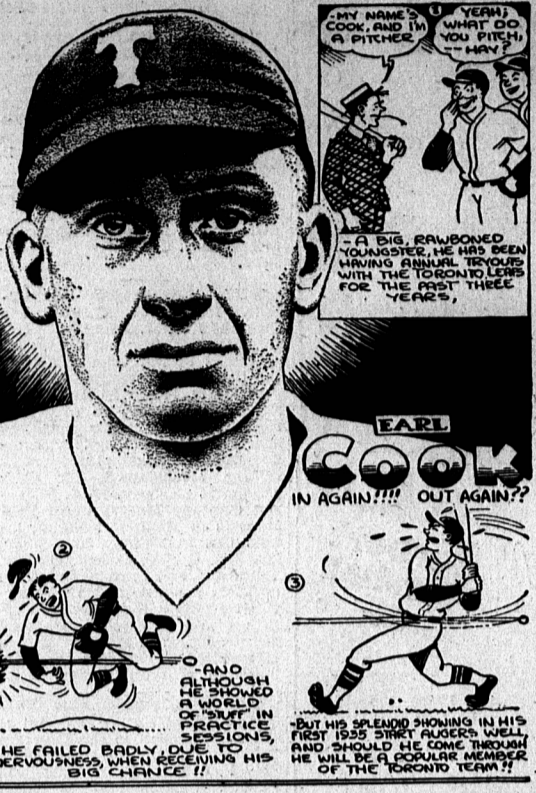

ESTABLISHES NEW WORLD'S SHOTPUT MARK

PHILADELPHIA, April 26.—The sturdy young sons of Louisiana State University, led by "Baby" Jack Torrance, today signaled their first big Eastern invasion by monopolizing individual honors in a record-breaking outburst marking the first day's competition at the 41st Pennsylvania relay carnival.

Torrance, the 300-pound behemoth who has pulverized nearly all of the world's shotput standards, entertained a crowd of 12,000 spectators at Franklin Field by hurling the 12-pound ball to a new record distance of 52 feet, 1-4 inches.

Just to keep Jack company two Pennsylvania boys took turns heaving the missile but the best either could do was keep within 10 feet of Torrance as the post-graduate policeman of Baton Rouge wiped out the former world mark of 50 feet, 5 1-2 inches, made by Leo Sexton of New York, in 1922.

Glenn Hardin and Nathan Blair gave Louisiana State two other triumphs but they had their troubles before achieving them. Hardin, who holds the world record of 50.6 seconds for the 100 metre hurdles, needed a big lead in this event to offset a bad spill in the 200 metre hurdles.
