### IN MEMORIAM

MR. J. M. MCKINNON.

The funeral of the late John M. McKinnon took place Sunday afternoon, April 30th, from the family residence at 420 Prince Street to Harwood Hill cemetery, where the interment took place. Many friends and spectators witnessed the cortege all along the route. A large number of the members of N. Clarke Wallace L. O. E., followed in the hearse, the procession being headed by the Coronation Band. The Rev. T. A. Rogers of St. Andrew's conducted the service at the house, while the worship service of the order at the grave was conducted by Bro. J. W. McKenzie and Brother N. J. McKenzie. A large number of floral tributes were laid on the grave, showing the high esteem in which the deceased was held by all classes of the community. These include a broken cross from the family, an arch with the emblems of the Orange order presented by the lodge; a wreath from Mr. H. F. Nease; wreath from D. B. McLeod; wreath from Mr. and Mrs. Murdoch McKinnon, the former a brother of the deceased; crescent from Mr. and Mrs. John Ferguson; crescent from the teachers of the Ashby Sunday School; and wreath from the True Blue Lodge. Among the out-of-town relatives attending the funeral was Murdoch Kennedy, M. P., of Queen's County, P. E. Island. The above is a son of the late John McKinnon of Rose Valley, P. E. Island, and had a large number of friends in this Province.

MR. ALEXANDER BUCHANNAN.

Entered into rest at Rose Valley, Lot 67, on Monday, April 27th, Alexander Buchanan of Bradalbane, in the 84th year of his age. Mr. Buchanan was enjoying vigorous health up to the day of his death, which was very unexpected. He left his home in Bradalbane early in the morning of the above date and was going to visit his sick neighbour at Rose Valley, which is two miles distant. He just reached the door of the neighbour's house, when suddenly he was overcome by an attack of heart failure, and died instantly. The unexpected news of his death, was a great shock to all of his wife and family, but also to all who knew him. Mr. Buchanan emigrated from the Isle of Skye, Scotland in the year 1858, being 26 years of age. He then settled on a farm in Bradalbane, where he lived the remainder of his life. The farm at that time was all covered with hazy forest, but through patient toil and perseverance he cleared the land and soon procured a comfortable home. This home was ever known for its kindness and hospitality, and was always open to the needy and homeless. Mr. Buchanan was a man of a gentle disposition, and a loving father and husband. He was an active member of the Presbyterian church, and lived an upright and faithful Christian life. He will not only be missed in the home, but also in the community of which he was a highly respected citizen and prosperous farmer. His funeral on Wednesday 19th, to Springtown Cemetery was largely attended, despite the unfavorable condition of the roads. The service was conducted by Rev. John McCall, who spoke appropriate words of comfort to the bereaved wife and family. The text was—1 Sam. 20:18—Then Johnathan said to David, tomorrow is the new moon, and thou shalt be missed, because thy seat will be empty. Mr. Buchanan leaves to mourn a sorrowing wife, four sons and three daughters. The sons are:—John A. and George of Alberta, Malcolm of Bradalbane and Donald in the household of Grand Pre, N. S., and Mrs. Costello of Boston. The daughters are:—Mrs. Hubert Reeves of Freetown; Mrs. Boates of Mass. The pall bearers were:—William MacKinlay, Duncan Macdonald, Henry Dixon, Hugh MacLure, Dan W. MacDonald and Hugh Nicholson.

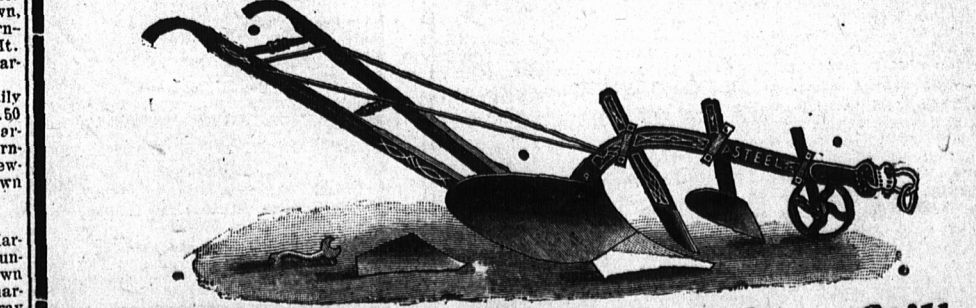
