FINANCE

NEW YORK, March 3—(AP)—Falling utilities shoved the stock market averages a bit lower again Saturday. Strength in aircrafts and motors proved insufficient to stop the retreat.

The Associated Press average of 60 selected stocks slipped 1 of a point to 49.4. Shares transferred totaled 274,710—the smallest short session since Jan. 22—compared with 377,730 last Saturday.

Included in the decline were Consolidated Edison, North American, Public Service and United Gas Improvement. The last named hit a low for the year. A new bottom also was touched by Electric Power & Light which, however, rallied to close unchanged. The Associated Press average of 15 utilities reached a new low for 1940.

Metals accompanied the utilities downward. Anaconda, Kennecott, and American Smelting showed minus signs.

The market was quiet for Canadian issues and only a few stocks changed hands, mostly at unchanged levels. The changes were confined to advances of 1-8 for International Nickel and Lake Shore.

Steels were uneven and lightly traded. Aviation stocks got a boost from buying interest which lifted Douglas, United Aircraft and Martin. General Motors and Chrysler immediately benefited.

TORONTO, March 3—(CP)—Stocks shifted within a narrow range in the final session of the week and closed practically unchanged in the average from Friday's close. Industrials and golds were down .06 and .22 respectively in the index and the base metal and western oil groups were up .12 and .10. Volume was fair for a two-hour session at 175,000 shares.

Madsen moved in volume of 60,000 shares and advanced to 51 cents. The close at 49 1-2 cents netted a gain of 5 1-2 cents. Buffalo-Ankerite firmed 20 cents and Pickle Crow and East Malartic 5 cents. Hallnor weakened 35 cents and losses of 5 cents were boarded by O'Brien, Teck Hughes and San Antonio.

Smelters had a minor setback and other senior base metal issues held steady. Falconbridge and Pend Oreille registered moderate strength. Gains predominated in the steel and paper groups while the food groups were lower and the other group mainly steady. The Abitibi issues ruled higher.

Western oils traded quietly with a final loss of 2 cents for Anglo-Canadian and gains of 1 to 2 cents for Home Oil and Okalta. Royaltie firmed 1-2.

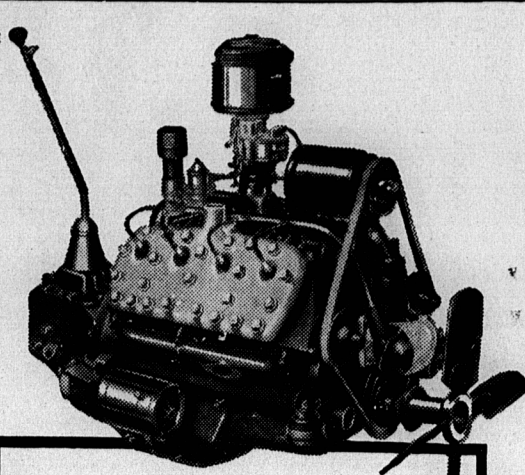

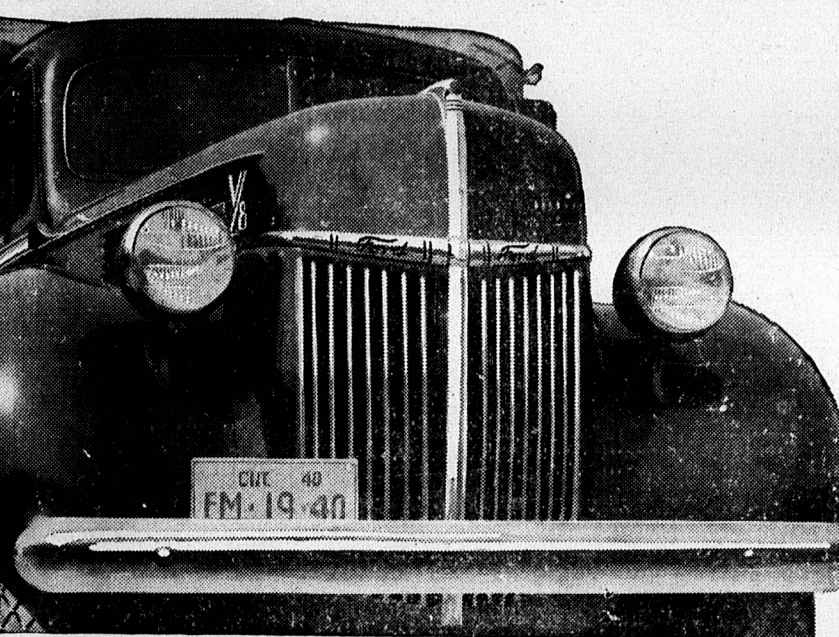

It is important that as spring approaches thought be given to the seeding program so that plans will be well in hand by seeding time. This is particularly true with regard to the forage crops. Many factors will govern the varieties and species chosen but one main consideration should be kept in mind and that is "quality". The best forage crop seeds available should be used in order that the risk of poor stands and consequently poor crops may be reduced to the minimum. The following rules should be kept in mind when buying forage crop seed requirements, states R. M. MacVicar,

Division of Forage Plants, Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa.
1. Choose the species which your own experience or the experience of your neighbors has indicated are the best for your conditions. For example if you have alfalfa best for hay and pasture buy alfalfa—not seed of some other species because it is a few cents cheaper.
2. Acquaint yourself with the established varieties of the species you grow. For example there may be a variety of soybeans much better adapted for your locality than the variety you have been growing. Information on new and old varieties of forage crops is readily obtainable.
3. Buy registered seed or if it is not available ask for certified seed. In this way you will be protected as to the purity of the variety.

4. Do not buy seed that is not number one grade as to germination, purity and freedom from weed seeds. The purchase of low grade seed is obviously false economy.
5. When available, buy approved Canadian grown seed in preference to imported seed.

MONTREAL, March 3—(CP)—Stock market traders found little of interest in Saturday's short session.

A bright spot popped up here and there, however, and some light profit selling occurred in C. P. R., which slipped a minor fraction before rallying to close even at 7 1-4. To the outside slightly in quiet selling were International Petroleum, Asbestos, Canada Cement, Hollinger and Canadian Celanese.
