CANADIAN PLANTS TO SUPPLY 55 ENGINES
 MONTREAL, Que. Oct. 16—A total of 55 locomotives required to increase the motive power of Canadian National Railways have been ordered from Canadian plants located at Montreal and Kingston and are part of the \$15,000,000 equipment program announced as pending by Sir Henry Thornton, president of the system, prior to sailing for Europe about a month ago.

Of the 55 locomotives ordered the Montreal Locomotive Works, Limited, are to supply 30 of the 4-0-4 Northern type, together with 10 8-wheel switching locomotives. The Canadian Locomotives Company at Kingston is to supply the remainder consisting of 15 locomotives of the Santa Fe 2-10-2 type and ten 8-wheel switching locomotives. The Northern type, known as the "6100" class, is a product of Canadian National engineers and has been designed for long-distance service with speed and power, and has proved entirely satisfactory under diverse circumstances. The Santa Fe type is a powerful freight locomotive.
