A horse careered up Queen Street yesterday afternoon, about 10 o'clock, caused quite a lot of excitement before being caught.

Frank Beales, City, left for George town, yesterday afternoon en route to Boston. Mr. Beales will return about April 1st, accompanied by Mrs. Beales.

At the police court in this city yesterday the prohibition case against St. V. McLeod, Mary J. McMillan and M. Murphy were adjourned till the 22nd. One drunk, E. Hennessey, was fined \$2 or 5 days.

Archibald McLean, formerly of Bridgetown, now of Raymore, Sask. is visiting friends in Charlottetown. It is five years since Mr. McLean left this province. He now conducts a large general store in Raymore. He had the distinction of starting the first store in that town, beginning on a very small scale. He is a son of Rev. D. McLean of this city.

On the night of the election, Wednesday, Inspector Jenkins made the rounds of the city accompanied by the police officers. He found everything in a most creditable condition at about midnight at which time there was but few people on the streets and sobriety and good order was prevailing. All the bars were closed and for an election night it was remarkably quiet.

The annual meeting of the Canadian Seed Growers Association was held at Ottawa on February 8th. The Delegates from the Island planned to bring up the question of the continuation of the distribution of seed grown from registered stock by the Ass'n, but did not reach Ottawa in time on account of being detained by the ice conditions in the Strait. Last year the Association purchased 1000 bushels of oats in P. E. Island and sold it in Quebec, and it was hoped by the delegates that 2000 bus. would be purchased this year, but the business was all transacted before they reached Ottawa. The meeting was however a great success and some excellent papers were read, which will be printed in the annual report of the Association.

A London despatch which will interest many in this province follows:—At the meeting of the National Rifle Association today, Lord Chesham read the correspondence which had taken place between the association and Captain Birdwhistle with regard to the Ross rifle, and declared that the allegation that had been made with regard to the prohibition of the Ross rifle was without the slightest foundation. The council of the association had given the dominion authorities the opportunity of altering the Sunderland sight, and had accordingly extended the time for submitting sights until the end of April. There was no discussion at the meeting with regard to this matter, although one member remarked that "Rifle shooting is dying here while in the Dominion it is promoted in every possible way. Military claims are largely responsible for this." Several members urged that the Bisley ranges should be open Sundays for practice only.
