

**Will Rogers Last Film At Prince Edward**

The battle of the century is on at the Prince Edward Theatre where "Steamboat Round the Bend" presents Will Rogers and Irvin S. Cobb in a hilarious, high-comedy rivalry that is tops for the season's film offerings.

"Steamboat Round the Bend" is war in sentiment, rich in characterizations, replete with thrills and reveals Rogers in a new and more human light—in what is probably the greatest role of his career.

As captain of the "Claremore Queen," a ramshackle old tub, Rogers is involved in the romance of Anne Shirley and John McGuire. Their happiness is threatened when McGuire kills a man in the girl's defence, gives himself up on Rogers' advice and is condemned.

Of course, the girl and Will Rogers blame each other for the boy's plight, but their desire to help him draws them together in a rich friendship. While they strive to earn enough money to pay for his appeal, Rogers is indulging in his old rivalry with crusty Irvin S. Cobb, captain of the shiny "The Pride of Paduch."

The two dramatic currents blend when Rogers steams down to New Orleans to save McGuire and is involved in the big steamboat race. The climax, packed with suspense and explosive comedy, brings the film to a happy conclusion.

In the leading role, Rogers tops the best of his previous performances. Anne Shirley is unusually effective in the romantic lead and round, jovial Irvin Cobb lives up to his reputation as one of the funniest men in America.

"Steamboat Round the Bend" is the final Will Rogers film to be screened in Charlottetown.

**Famed Wig-Maker Friend of Kings**

LONDON, March 30—(CP)—The death of Willie Clarkson removes one of the most interesting figures in London's life, writes "An Old Friend" in the London Observer.

Eminent as a wig-maker and famous as an impersonator and originator of costumes, he became a social personality who was never absent from first night and was in demand at the most important social functions.

He deliberately dressed to make himself a character, and used to allow his hair and beard to grow in fantastic shapes. Wherever he went he selected some appropriate accoutrement which set off his handsome features and imposing manner.

The pride of his life was that he was once mistaken for King Edward VII, who knew him intimately and often consulted him about fancy dress.

Sarah Bernhardt was a special friend of his, and he took particular pride in the wig in which she played Magdalen and had to throw her hair over the feet of the actor playing the part of the Saviour. The wig was of natural hair, 60 inches long.

The most extraordinary costume he ever devised was for a man who wanted to go to a fancy dress ball at Covent Garden as an armchair. He won a first prize, but his friends kept sitting down on him all the evening, and by the time dawn came the poor fellow was nearly dead.

She was also a fellow of the Association for the Advancement of Science, a member of the American Association of University Women and a Fellow of the British and German Astronomical Societies. For several years she served as professor of astronomy at Mount Wilson Observatory and, in 1926, she was a delegate to the third Pan-Pacific Congress in Japan.
